Discussion around exploring new initiatives for attendance, this is an ongoing issue for all schools, report figures back to BOT mid-year.

2. Principal's Report February - John Rohs

The NZ Herald documentary Under the Bridge has attracted an enormous amount of interest in our school. John has met with some former students who wish to set up an active alumni group focussing on raising funds for projects to benefit our students. The establishment of a Charitable Trust would be required, Craig Inder, Inder Lynch, Solicitors has been approached and the firm have agreed to act pro-bono on our behalf.

Papakura High School will be working closely with Kauri Flats School, particularly in the area of Science and Technology and also acknowledge careful planning is required for the new community which will feed into our school (75% Indian, 25% Pasifika).

Discussion on COL - Kelvin Rd is the only school not involved at this stage, maximum number of schools in each COL is 10 which includes one high school.

Ngati Tamaoho have gifted to our school for our three whanau. These names are of tremendous significance as they relate to the loss of iwi settlements and places following the Raupatu (the land confiscations during the war of the 1860's) The three names are:

Kirikiri

Otuuwairoa

Te Aparangi

Attached to your BOT reports is the information from <u>Ngati Tamaoho</u> which has been shared with us regarding these names.

The Chromebook evening held at school was a great success.

The formation of groups and practices for Polyfest are new well underway, with some groups practising every day. This year, along with kapa haka, we have Samoan, Tongan and Cook Island groups. The Polyfest event takes place in the week starting 13 March.

A Community Hui is to be held at Papakura Marae 16 March 2017 (venue to be confirmed) with four schools talking about Maori Language Provision for Papakura. Redhill, Kereru Park, Papakura Intermediate and Papakura High School.

Steve Waters will contact MOE and pursue a refund of \$.5m of funds spent on rebuilding plans on our behalf.
