

SUBJECT SELECTION FOR YEAR 10 – 2018



ART Visual (10ARV) See LBB

Pathway: Level 1 Visual Art or Art Design

The aim of art education is to enable students to learn to make art works and to develop an understanding of the actions and relationships of art in cultures and in society. It allows students to try a variety of practical art making processes and procedure, such as; drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture etc..... **Cost \$30.00**

ART Digital (10ARD) See LBB

Pathway: Level 1 Visual Art or Art Design

This is a computer based course, specialising in the range of activities offered to provide an opportunity to experience a range of disciplines, in preparation for future specialization. This option will incorporate digital photography, art design and filmmaking to enable students to produce digital based artworks. *Cost* \$30.00

BUSINESS STUDIES (10BUS) See PWL

Pathway: Level 1 Economics or Employment Skills

This course covers two areas - The Enterprise Studies Programme and Economic Studies. Enterprise Studies develops skills and qualities needed to be an enterprising person in today's business world. Economic Studies is the study of decisions made by the consumer so that people can satisfy their wants by allocating and managing resources (time, money and skills). This course also aims to equip you with the basic financial life skills.

INTRODUCTION TO CARVING (10CRV) See MRI

This course is under review but it is thought we will be covering the meanings behind carvings and their designs. There will be some practical work involved. **Cost to be confirmed – to cover the materials of your carving.**

DANCE (10DAN) See IKA

Pathway: Level 1 Dance

Pathway: Level 1 Carving

Students will work with the elements of space, time, energy, body and relationships. They will develop personal, interpersonal and dance skills through using dance devices, and choreographic structure to compose original dance works. They will learn to choreograph their own work, and they will create and perform solo and group dance works to a live studio audience.

DRAMA (10DRA) See IKA

Pathway: Level 1 Drama

Drama is a practical course. It aims to develop a wide range of skills and an understanding of the theatrical process. The objectives of the course are to develop creativity skills through acting and movement, develop interaction with others, to increase their knowledge of a range of dramatic forms and to develop and build self-esteem and confidence. **Cost \$5.00**

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY (10TEC) See PTS

Pathway: Level 1 Engineering or Carpentry

This is a practical course which involves students in the processes of problem solving, designing, making of projects and the related theory. Students' awareness to the principles of design and the traditional practices of craftsmanship in a workshop environment is developed. You will choose either the wood or metal based option. *Cost* \$30.00

The objective of the course is for students to experience and become comfortable in using a wide range of software including word processing, spreadsheets, digital imaging, database, animation and web design.

HOSPITALITY (10HOS) See CBN

This course will help develop your design and creativity skills. You will learn how to develop new products and analyse their fitness for purpose. Students will also look into aspects of the health curriculum and create foods around the National Nutritional Guidelines for eating. Topics may include: Freestyling,New Zealand Beef and Lamb Burger Competition, Perfect Pasta, Just Cook, creating a nutritious meal for a family. *Cost \$25.00*

GRAPHICS (10GRA) See PTS

Graphics is a drawing course which involves Graphic Design, Presentation Drawing, Technical Drawing, Media use and Computer Aided Drawing (CAD). These skills are essential in today's technological world and is of value to students choosing careers in the manufacturing and construction pathways. *Cost \$10.00*

KAPA HAKA (10KPA) See PAL

New students who have a limited knowledge of Kapa Haka and experience, Powhiri, Karakia, Waiata, Te Reo Maori, Tikanga and Te Ao Maori will be given every opportunity to learn the basic aspects of the Maori Culture which are integral to Kapa Haka performance.

TE REO MAORI (10REO) See WRN

The course will engage in Te Aho Arataki Marau mo te ako i te reo or The Maori Curriuculum. It covers from level 1 to 4 to prepare the student for Level 1 Te Reo. Included in the course is the opportunity to complete homework online using languagenut to support the students development when away from school.

MUSIC (10MUS) See RBN

This course is designed to develop skills within all aspects of music, as well as creative, personal and interpersonal communication skills. Achievement is gained by learning the skills required to: participate in group and solo performances: create music through song-writing and using computer programmes such as Fruity Loops and Protools: learn basic music theory and aural skills through a wide range of musical styles; participate in the Junior Arts Festival at the end of the year. **Cost \$4.00**

SPORTS EDUCATION (10SPO) See BLD

This is an extension course for motivated students at Year 10 who have special interest or talent in the areas of Physical Education and Sports. Students will complete Level 1 NCEA achievement standards, and learn the basics of anatomy, biomechanics and physiology. The majority of the course will take place in the classroom, however, there will be some opportunity to participate in practical Physical Education. Students must have shown commitment and motivation in Year 9 Physical Education and a willingness to participate in Sport. Selection is at the discretion of the Head of PE.
