Our Future Identity

With increased numbers in our Year 9 enrolments in 2017 and even more for 2018, our school is definitely "on the up" With the introduction of our new whanau culture, there is a real feeling of change around the school.

One of the most exciting innovations in the school has been the initiative to create **Te Kaunihera a Akonga** - our Student Council. This body of 30 students - 10 representatives from each whanau, have been meeting every second Friday throughout the year. These students have been taking their role very seriously and with growing confidence, have started to articulate their vision for our school's future. They are keen as a group of school representatives, to forge ahead and work on a new identity for our school's future. This will include a new logo, school motto and values. These are well and truly needed as the Papakura High of 2017 is a very different one to the original Papakura High School of 1954, indeed the whole community has seen major changes in its demographics. While valuing the importance of the school's heritage, these students have developed a sense of ownership of the school's future direction.

The school has now engaged the services of Joanne Lottering from Design Impact, who will work with a sub-committee of Te Kaunihera a Akonga, to produce some drafts of a new logo or school crest. This is a very significant undertaking, as we are wanting a logo which is contemporary, relevant and in which the young people of Papakura High School can develop a sense of identity and pride. Design Impact as a graphic design company have captured our attention as the artists responsible for the very striking and strong logo which was commissioned for Papakura Intermediate School.

Our school is in the process of having a major facelift! As part of our school's overall property refurbishment, which began last year, the entire school is being repainted. Bright fresh colours have been chosen, to give the school a much more contemporary image - whilte, grey and teal are the new colours, which replace the very tired brown tones which have dominated for many years. The gymnasium is the first fully completed building in the project.
