The transient students in South Auckland are not new and a difficult issue for us to do much about

Our Junior teaching and learning programme is to undergo substantial changes, discussion with HODs is due to take place next week, have some fairly radical changes as to how we organise our school. With the scrutiny from ERO and the MOE it is vital that we undergo change.

At our next Whanau Hui we want to ask whanau how we can engage with them, the ones who want to and those who don't. There are a lot of fairly tough challenges for us in this area, in particular attendance and achievement but we are not prepared to keep the status quo.

At our next BOT meeting, if we can plan ahead, ERO is coming to join us at 4.00pm, until the beginning of our Board meeting. The following day ERO will want to present their initial findings to the BOT, unfortunately this will be middle of the day and we appreciate this will not be easy for you all to make.

LSM issue - Ted is meeting with John and SLT tomorrow briefly to discuss Sally Dalzell who he believes would be a good choice. There is also resourcing available for a Senior Leaders coach for a fixed amount of time, fixed term (as suggested by ERO). We see this as future focused and we are expecting that there could be interest from aspiring, motivated senior leaders or principals around the Auckland area. We see this as a tremendous support for our staff in engagement of our students and achievement. By the end of this year there will be a published ERO report.

A point to celebrate is that our roll has remained very strong and we are still seeing an increase.

We continue to be concerned about attendance and events that are taking students out of school. Last year, particularly for our seniors, we cut back activities from term 3 and will do so again this year. It is important that we look at more ways for these experiences to happen outside the school day.
