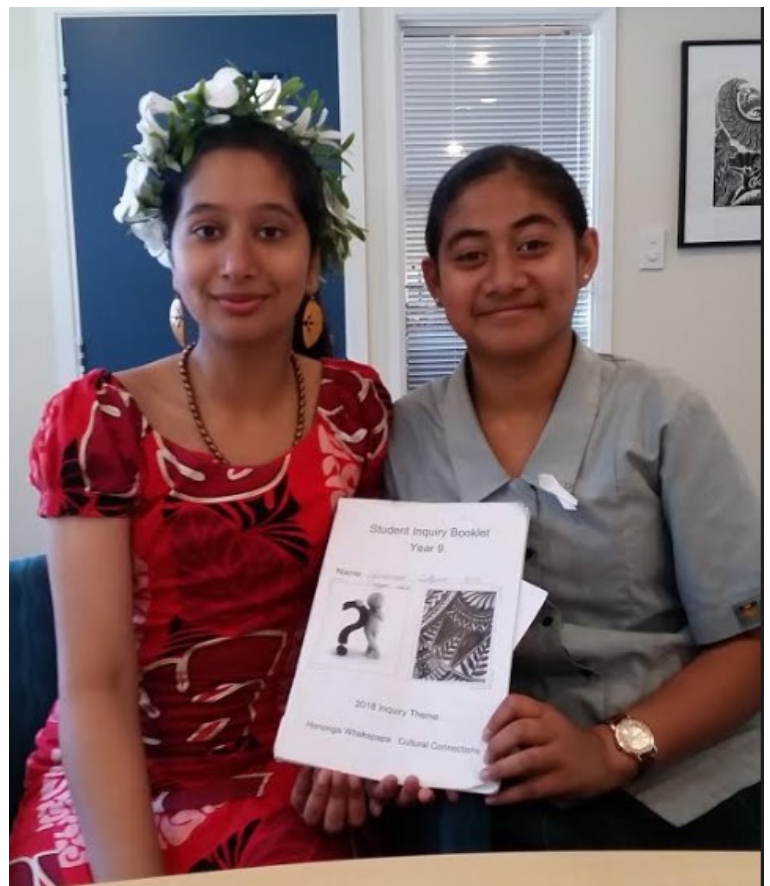
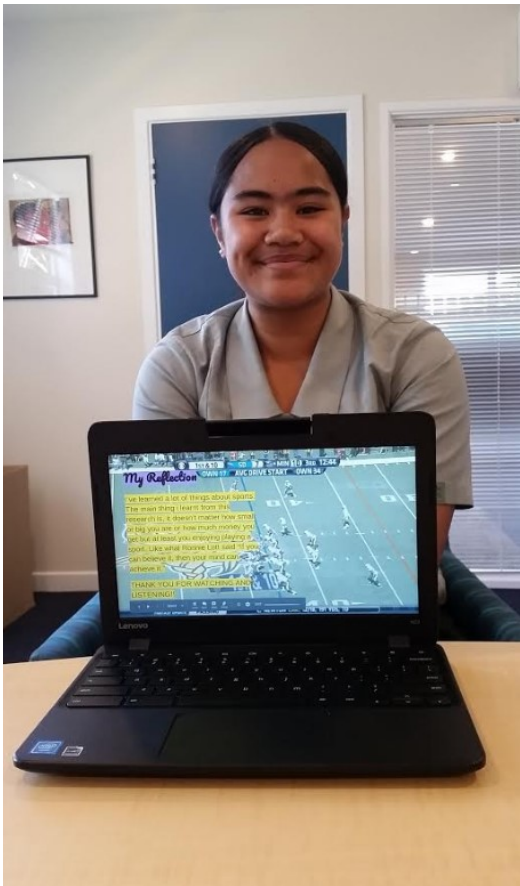

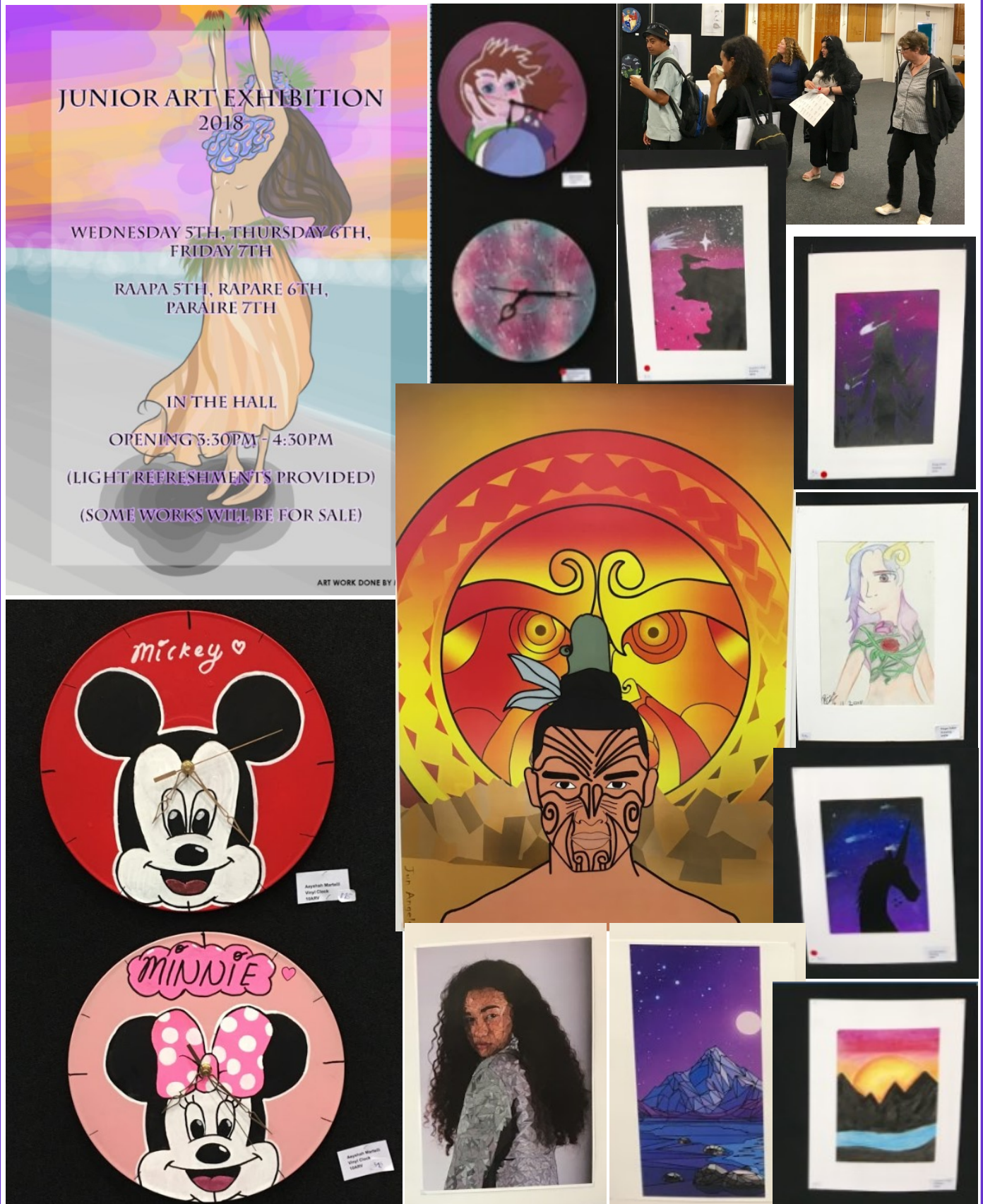
Since then, I have held just about every administration role - Reception, International Students and Homestays, Gateway and finally, Student Administration and Enrolments for the last 15 years.
