PAPAKURA HIGH SCHOOL CHILD/STUDENT PROTECTION POLICY

NAG 5 5.9

Rationale:

Children and students have a fundamental right to have all their needs met and to be safe from abuse and neglect.

This school is committed to supporting children/students, their whanau/families, agencies, staff, employees and contractors to meet the aims of the Vulnerable Children's Act 2014.

Purpose:

- 1. To provide a safe environment, free from physical, emotional, verbal, sexual or electronic abuse.
- 2. To recognise the role and responsibility of staff in the protection of children by identifying and responding to suspected child abuse or neglect.
- 3. To appropriately respond to concerns about the wellbeing of a child.
- 4. To ensure that all agencies, staff, employee and contractors and funding arrangements fulfil the requirement of the Act.

Definition:

Child abuse: Includes the physical, emotional and sexual abuse as well as neglect which is

the direct of a deliberate act or omission by an adult and which has the

potential or effect of serious harm to the child.

Child neglect: Failure or omission to care for a child. This can be physical, emotional,

medical, educational and a lack of supervision.

Guidelines:

- 1. The Principal will ensure that there are procedures in place to identify and respond to allegations of abuse.
- 2. The Principal and SLT work together with the Pastoral Care Team to improve the wellbeing of vulnerable children by working with other agencies available to the school.
- 3. The Principal will ensure that school recruitment practices are in line relevant Acts.
- 4. Sharing of information with outside agencies is permitted.
- 5. Staff will be provided with information and training in order to recognise and respond with suspected abuse and neglect.
- 6. The school will have in place policy and procedures to deal with an allegation involving a staff member.
- 7. The school will ensure that any external organisation that has a contracting and/or funding arrangement with the school will provide a copy of their child protection policy upon request.
- 8. Any external organisation that has a contracting and/or funding arrangement with the school must agree to the schools Policies and Procedures.
