Peer Support 2007



Their efforts and time were much appreciated by their Year 9 students and tutors.




A special mention goes to Ben Laughton who has been identified as a potential Northern Districts representative player for his leg spin bowling.

Junior Boys Soccer team



(5 times National Champs)






