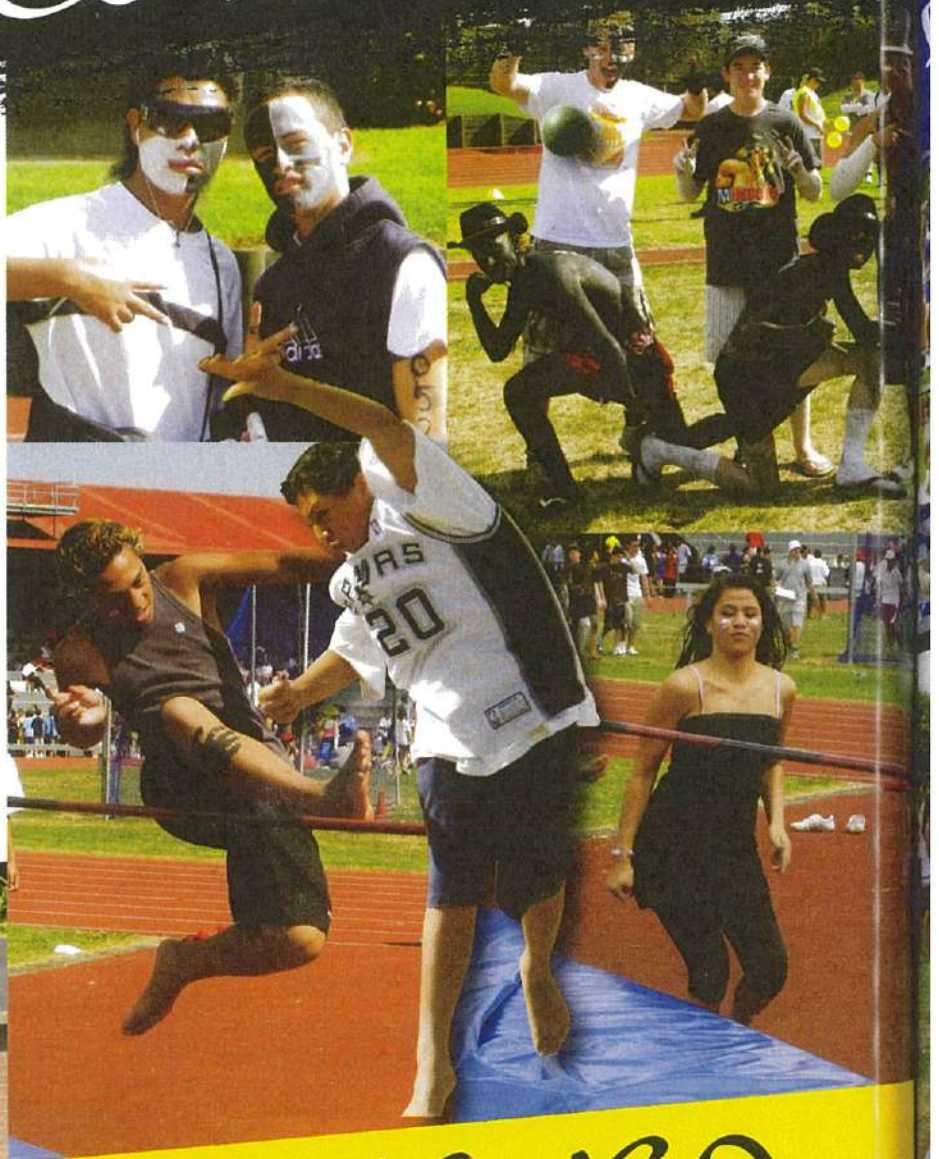


# BLEDISLOE HOUSE

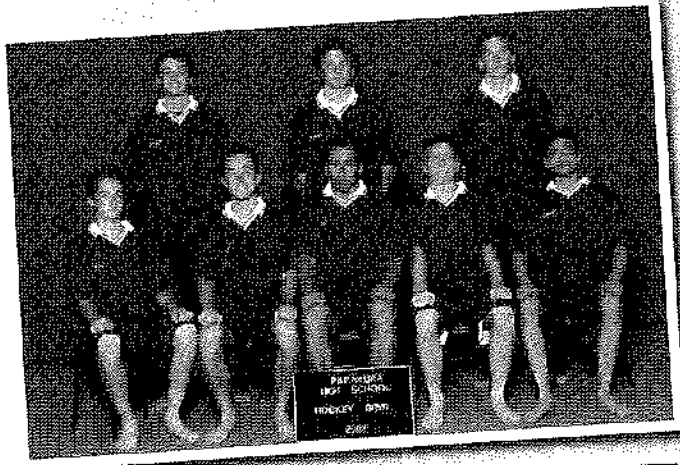


# HOCKEY

# GIRLS SOFTBALL

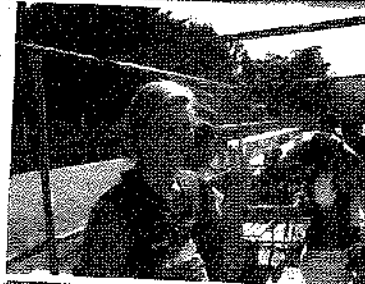
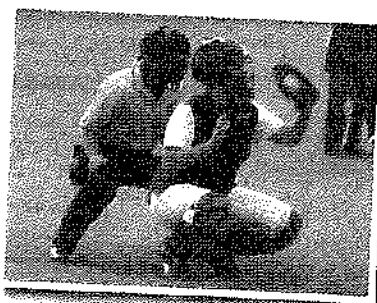

Upon completion of each part the students would also qualify for 4 NZQA Level 2 credits, a total of 8 credits could be gained to help for the year.

We had five students pass with 8 credits and two with 4 credits. We will be running this course about the same time next year and invite students to come along and participate in this well worthwhile course and it's free! The facilitator, Kerry Petrie has a great way with the students and I'm sure they will enjoy every moment of it.

In closing I would like to say to all the Coaches, Managers, Mums, Dads and Family who have given their support and time this year to Papakura High School Rugby, thank you sincerely. Without your contribution it just wouldn't be happening and we are appreciative of your ongoing support.

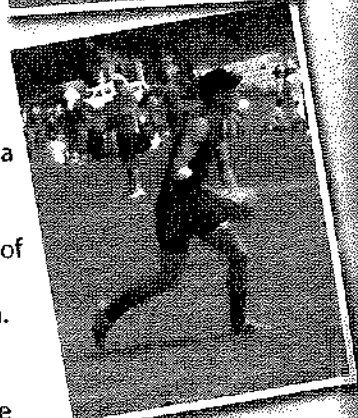
# TOUCH RUGBY

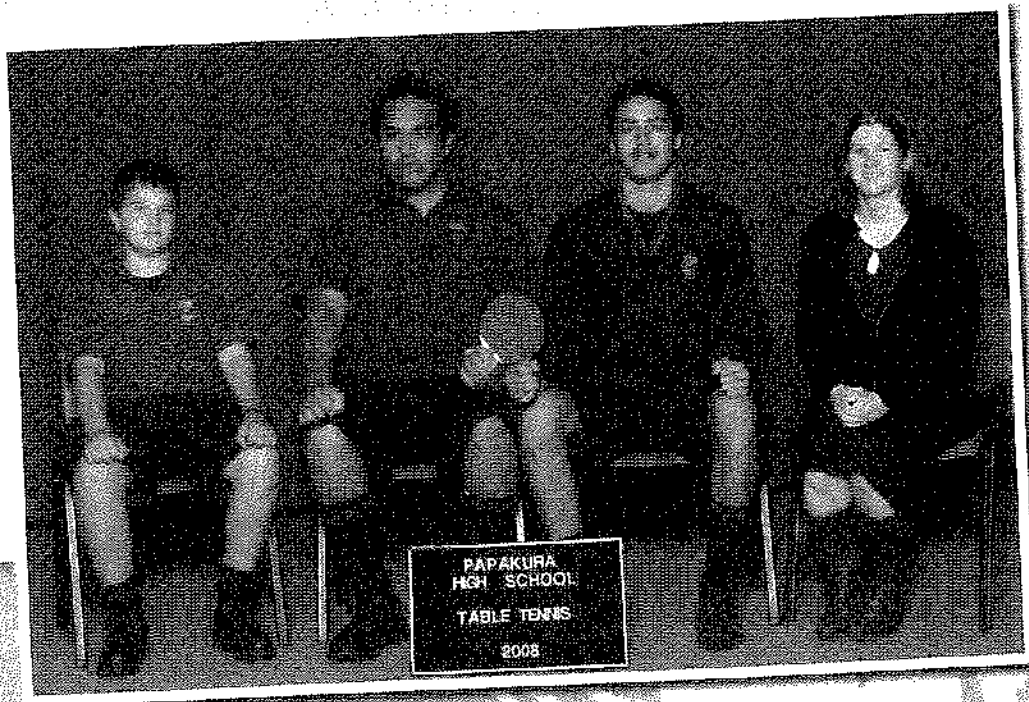
# TABLE TENNIS

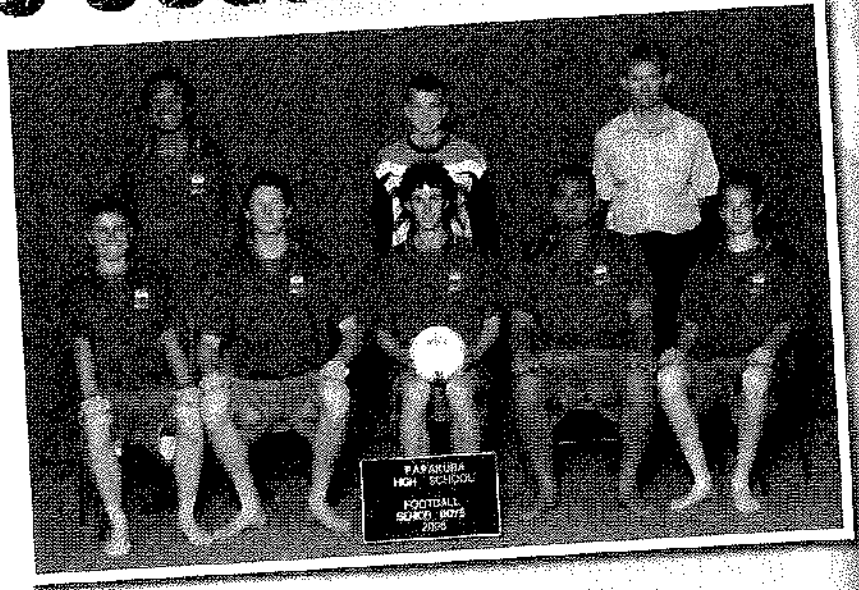




# 1ST XI BOYS SOCCER
