WRESTLING


Congratulations to the PHS Wrestling Team, who this year really proved themselves with an incredible performance over the season.







Senior Girls' Touch



Top try scorers were Tuku Leapi (backs) and Tau Mataafa (forwards).


Off the field the 1st XV has raised its profile around school and most of the


GIRLS' BADMINTON


So watch out for the Girls' Basketball


The boys played many a nail-biting game and had crowds hanging on to their seats, even winning over the staunch Rewa home supporters, who towards the end of the game were



As it transpired, the final was a repeat of the first match at Rosehill College; somewhat of a House of Pain,



The students made the day with their enthusiasm and the Seventh Formers did an excellent job of rallying the troops and ensuring that the day was a happy, enjoyable day without incident.


