Sports Institute

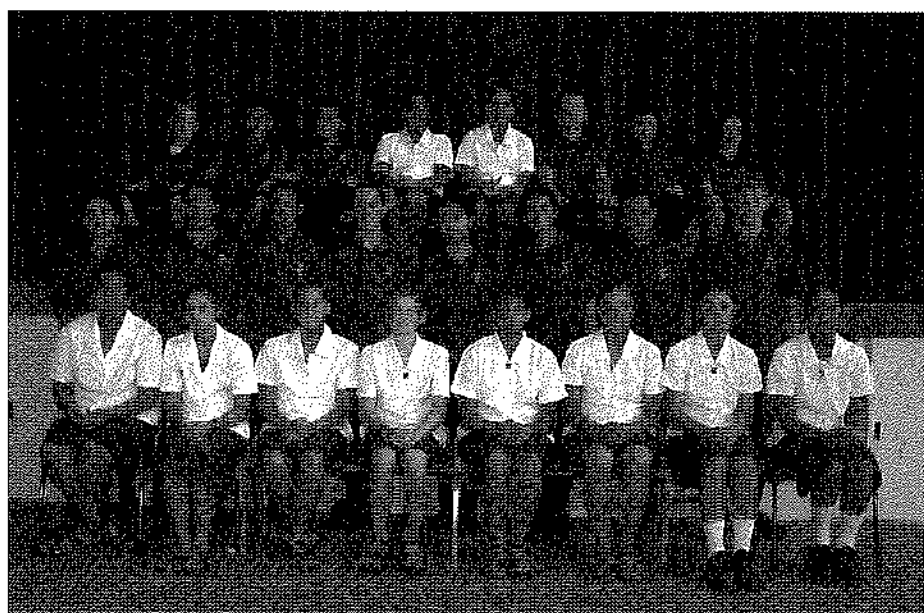

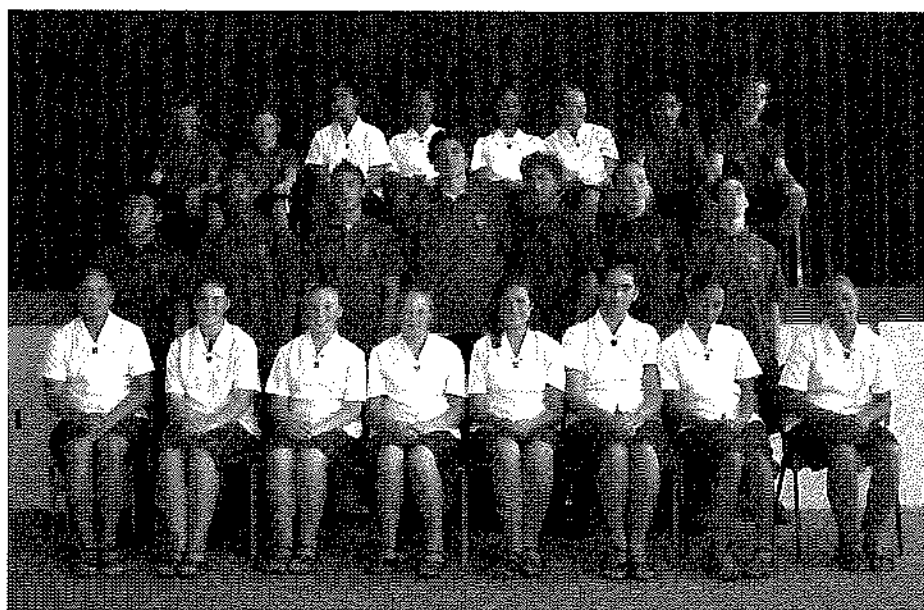

WRESTLING

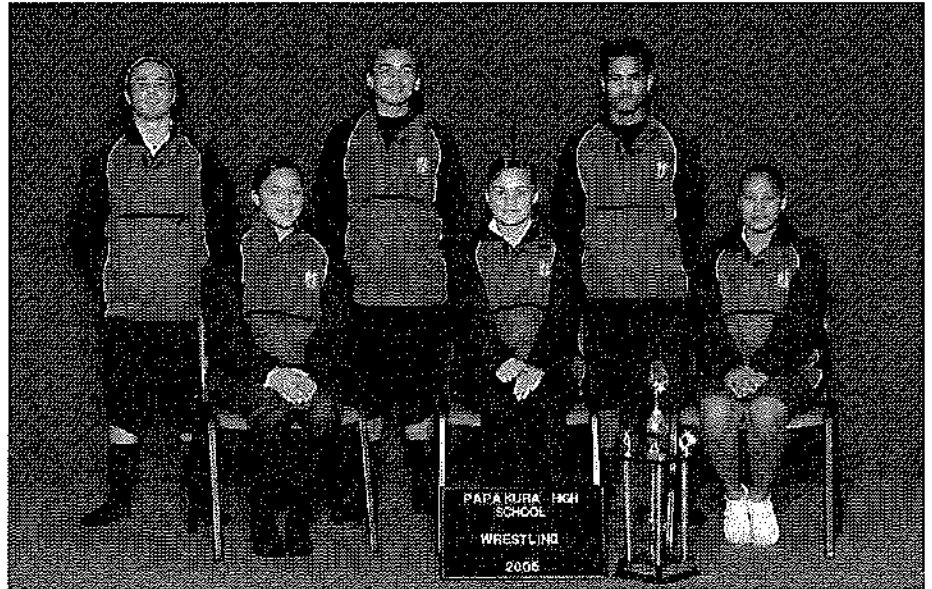
Congratulations to the PHS Wrestling Team, who this year really proved themselves with an incredible performance over the season.

Top try scorers were Tuku Leapi (backs) and Tau Mataafa (forwards).

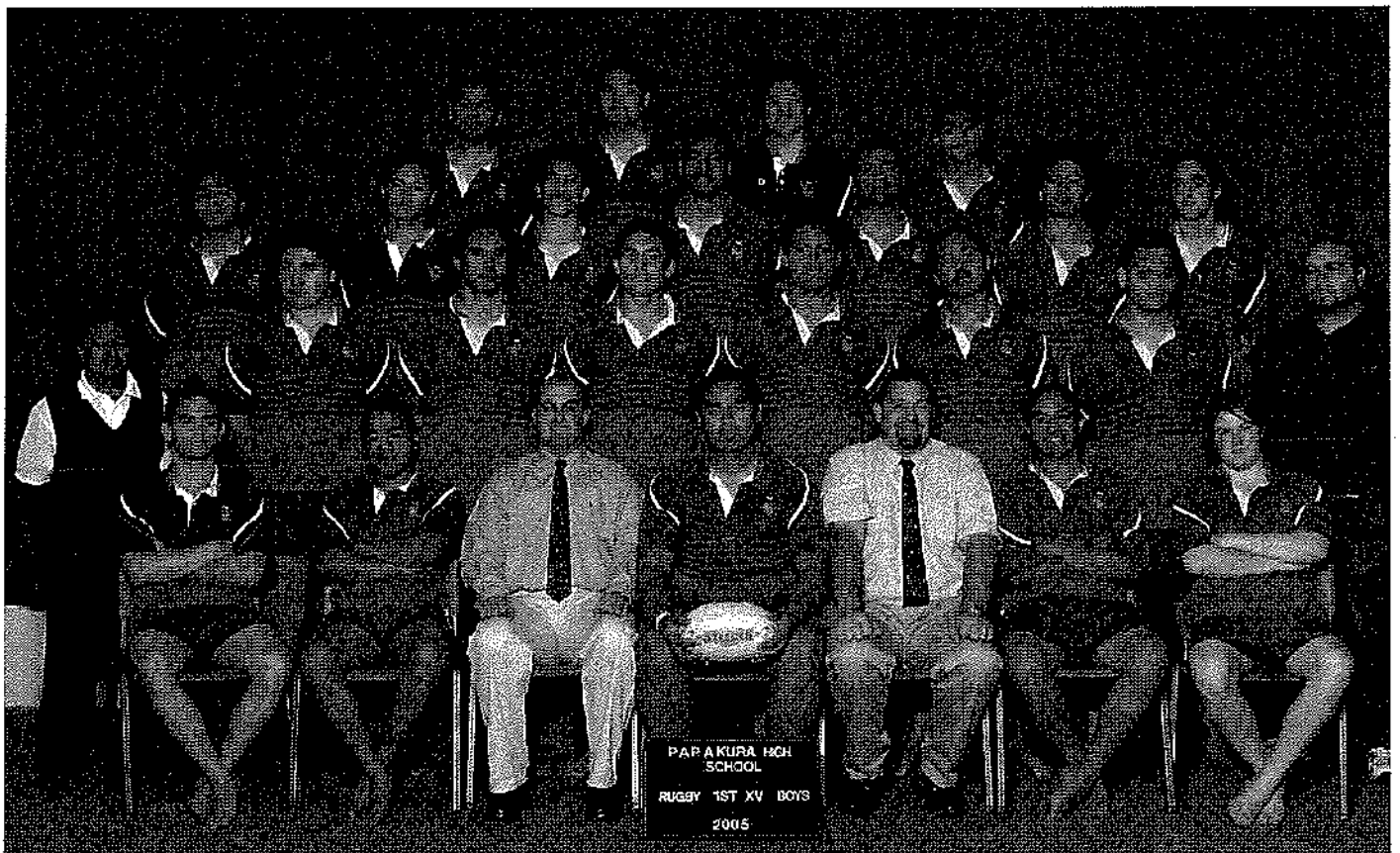
Off the field the 1st XV has raised its profile around school and most of the

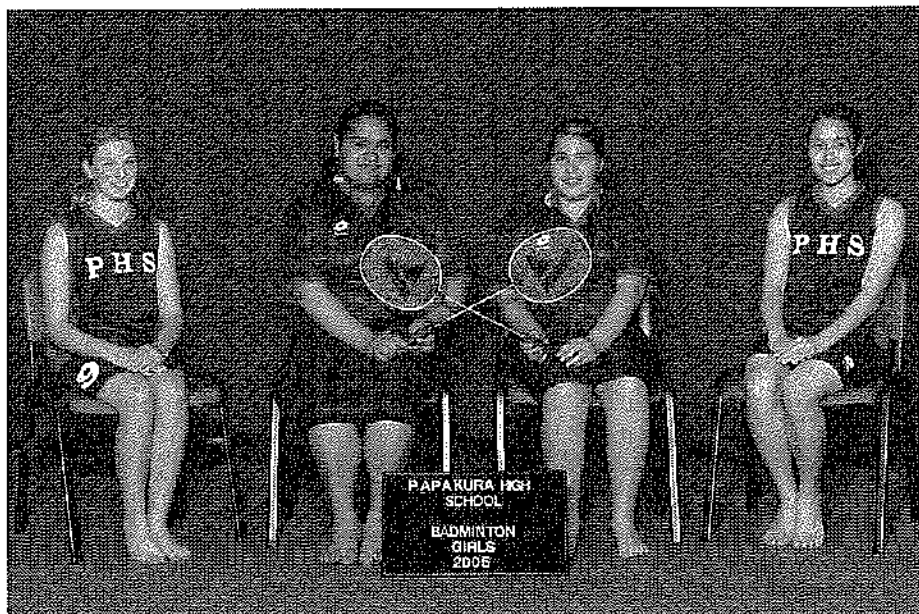

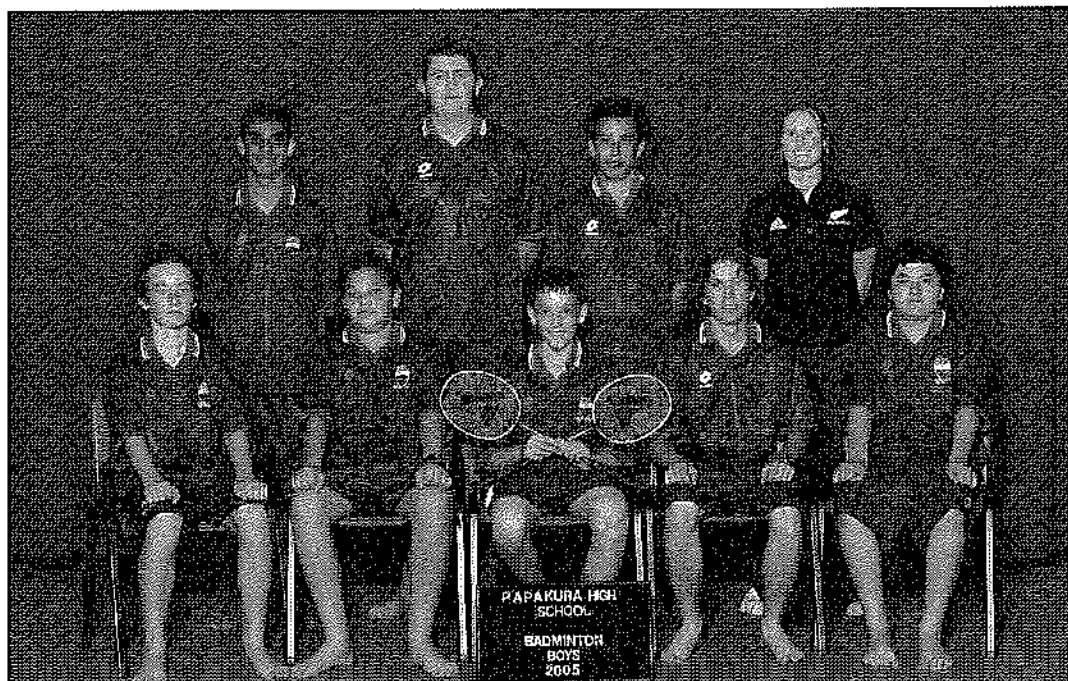

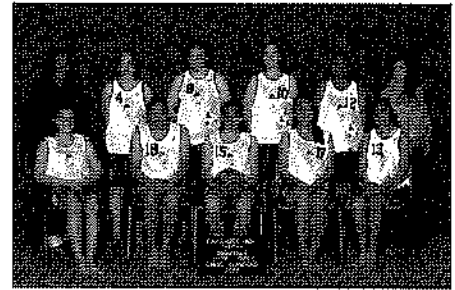
So watch out for the Girls' Basketball

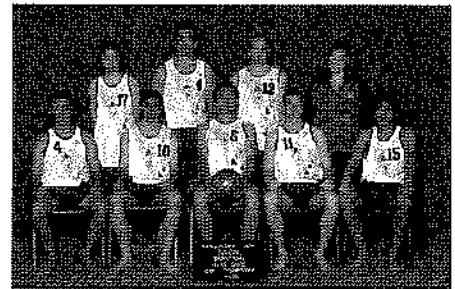
The boys played many a nail-biting game and had crowds hanging on to their seats, even winning over the staunch Rewa home supporters, who towards the end of the game were

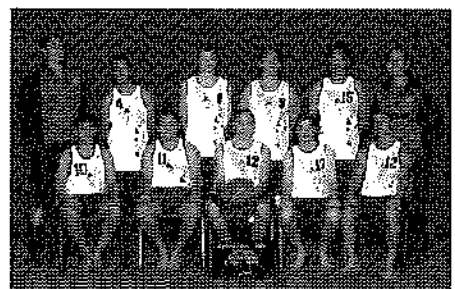

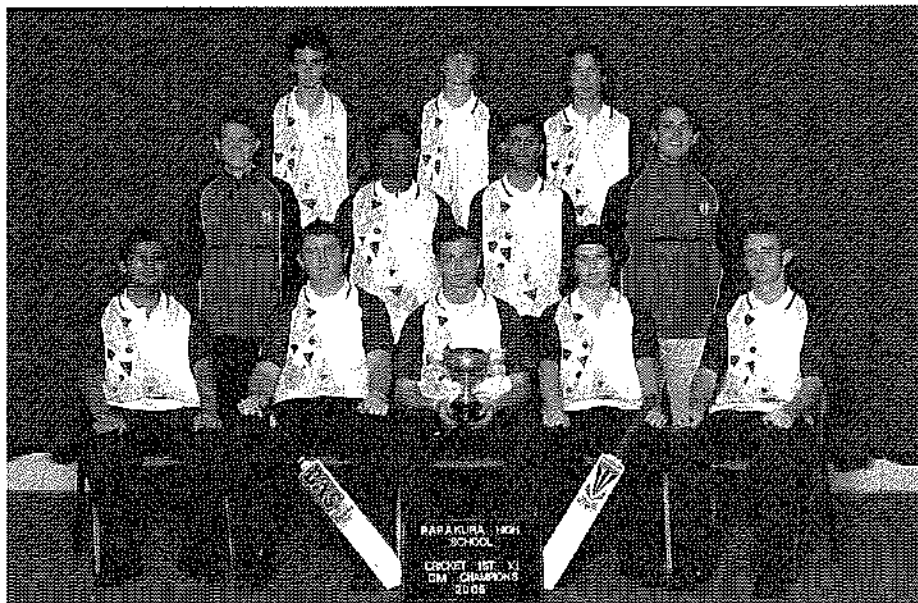

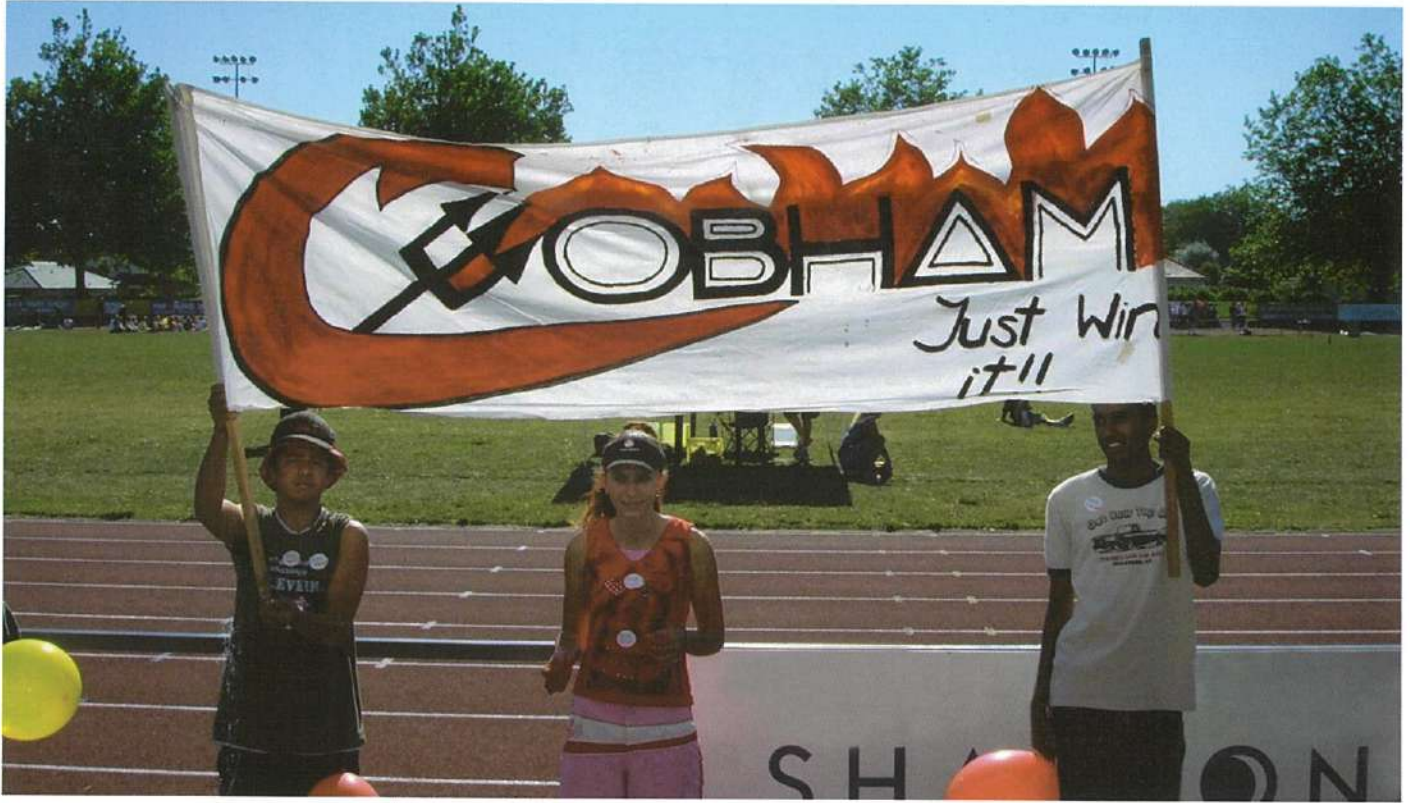

Freyberg House

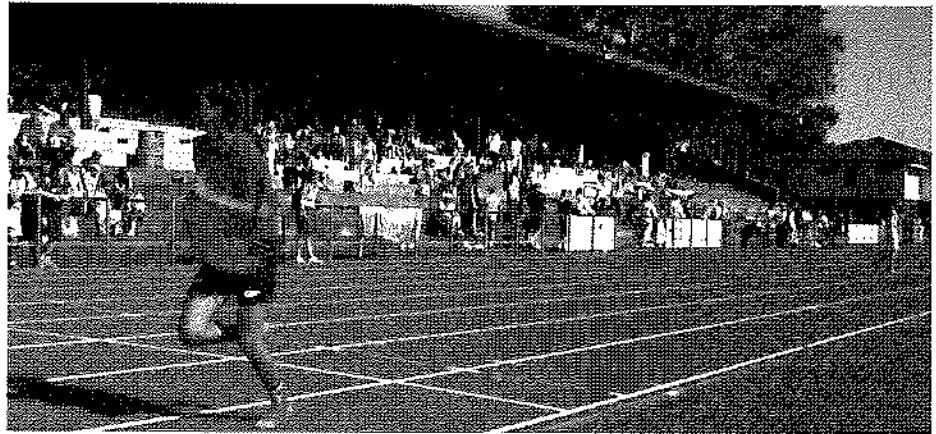
Athletics

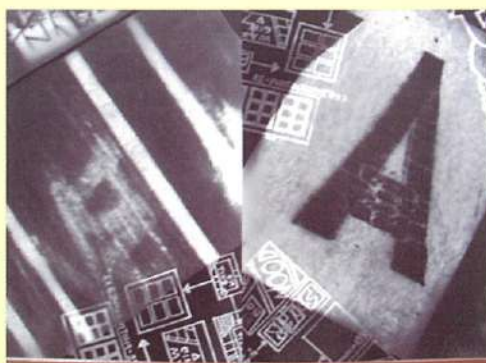
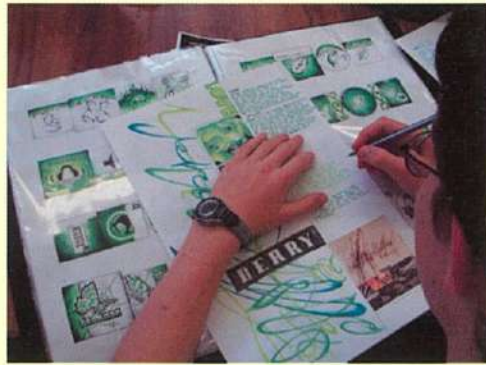
