ANTI HARASSMENT

In 2006, the school again trained a large group of Year 12 and 13 students as Anti-Harassment Contacts. Thirty six students were trained in total. Senior students were very keen to train and make themselves available as contact people for students who were being bullied in some way.

The training took place early in Term 1. Outside trainers were hired again for a day's training. This was most

informative and useful.

Students then made presentations at Assemblies, showed anti-bullying videos to Level Assemblies, had their photos displayed around the school so that students could approach them for help and met to discuss issues and progress. A "Safe Room" was set up where students could go at breaks for time out, with Anti-harassment students present for support. Posters were placed in classrooms explaining to students what constituted harassment and how

they could be helped. Contacts wear a visible badge so that students can identify them easily. A Request for Help box was placed in Student Reception so that any student could ask for help.

It is planned to train more contacts for 2007. It is the wish of the group that no student should feel alone if they are being bullied and that there are always people they can approach.

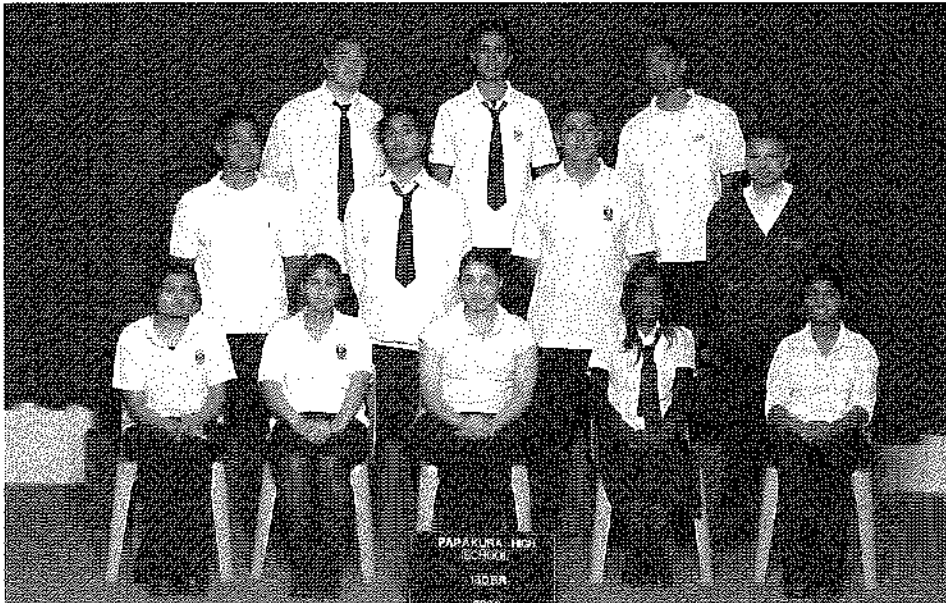

The ball required 'advertising' and our school had a lot of that. Two people made two completely opposite posters but these managed to cater

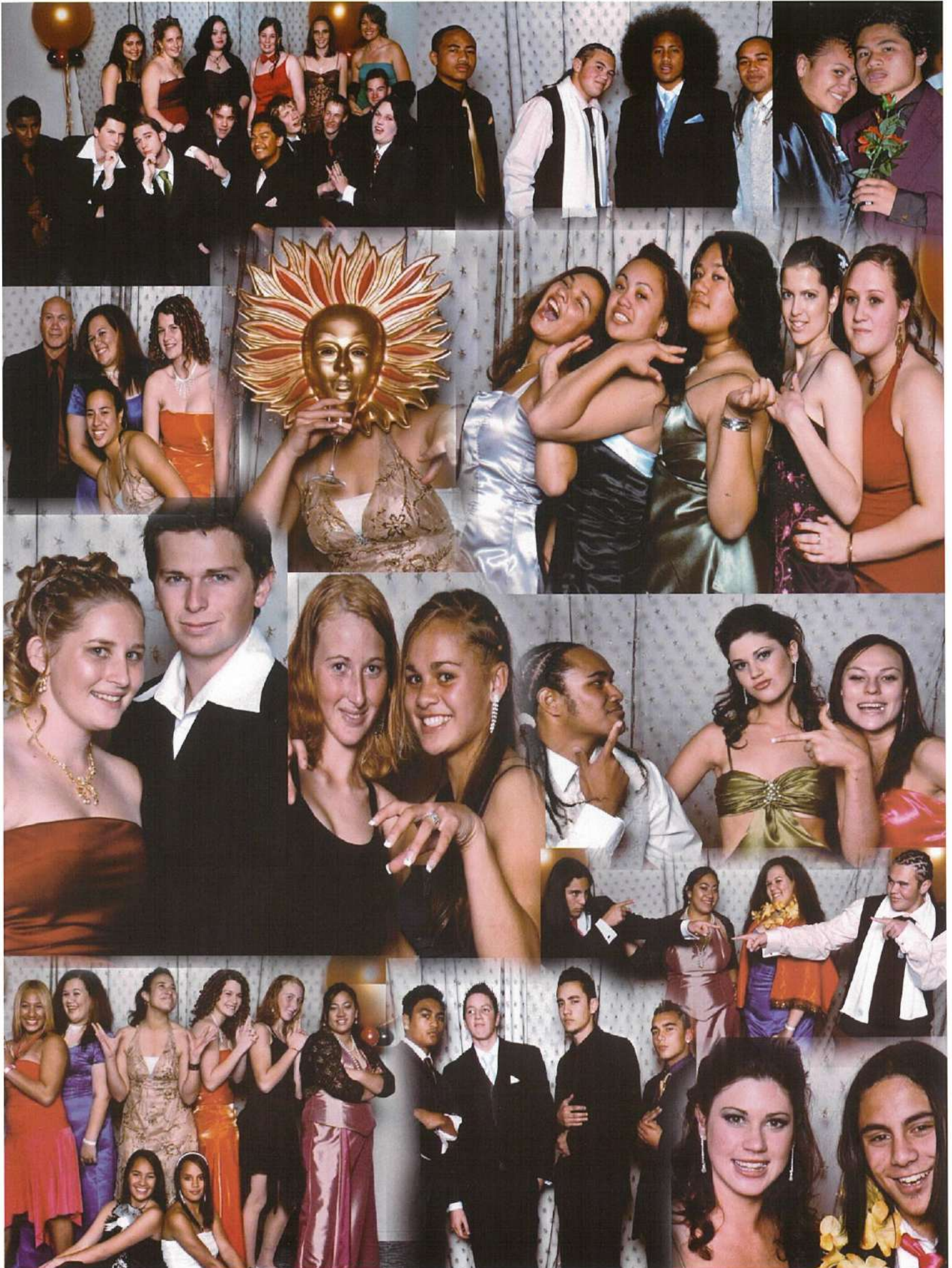

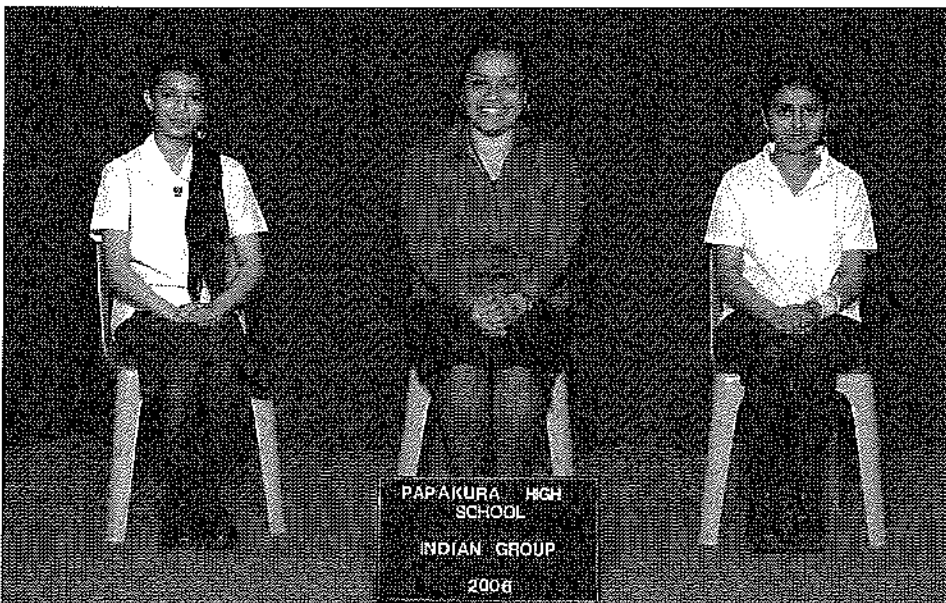

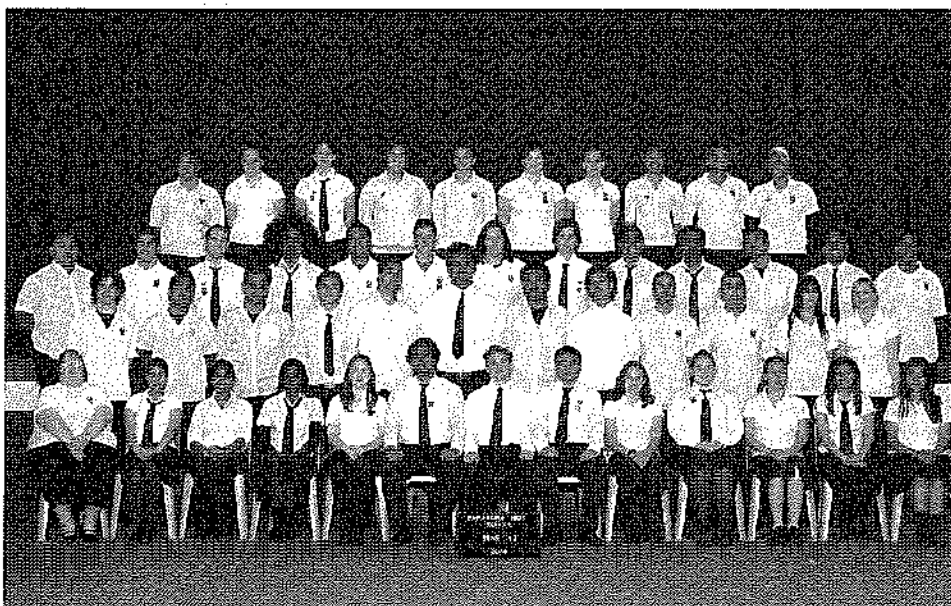

GYMNASTICS

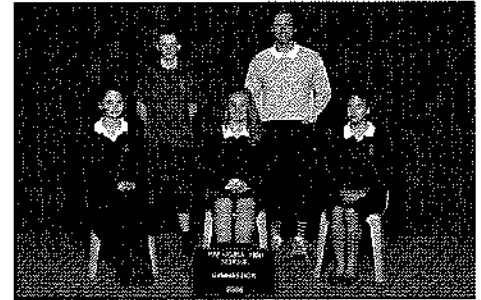

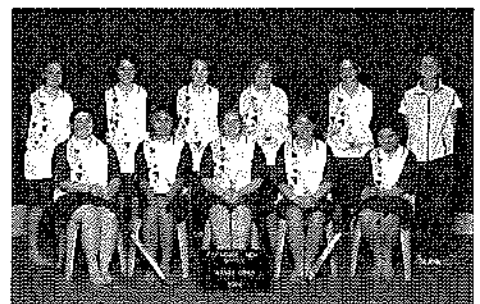

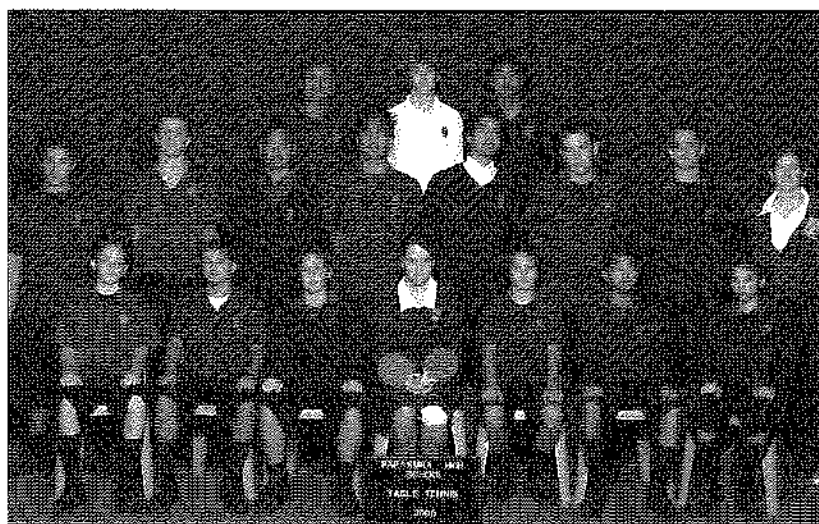

A huge "thankyou" to Mita and Debbie Tupaea for once again taking on the responsibility of coaching and managing this side.

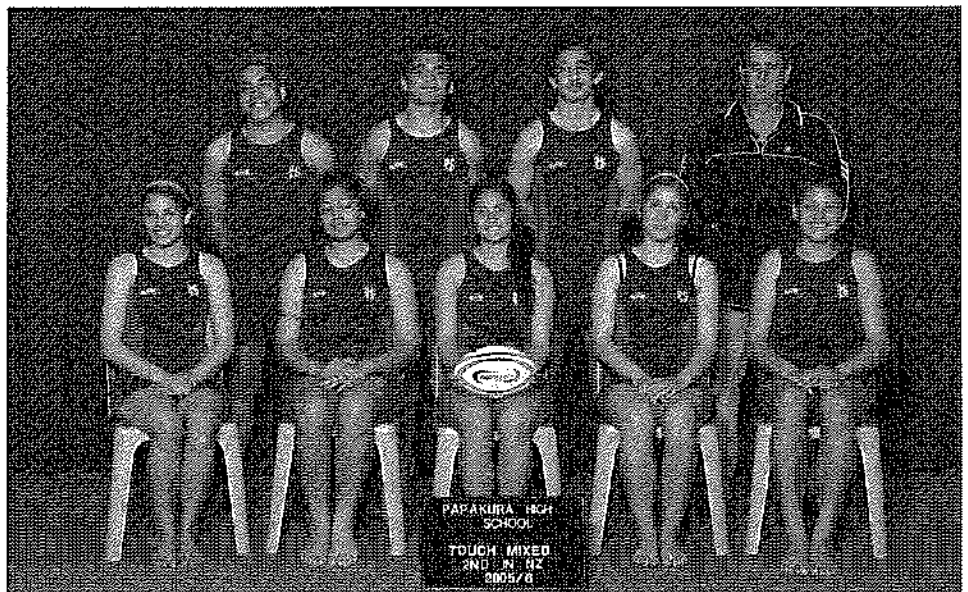

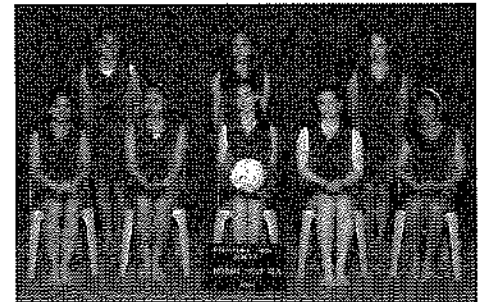
NETBALL INTERMEDIATE TEAM A

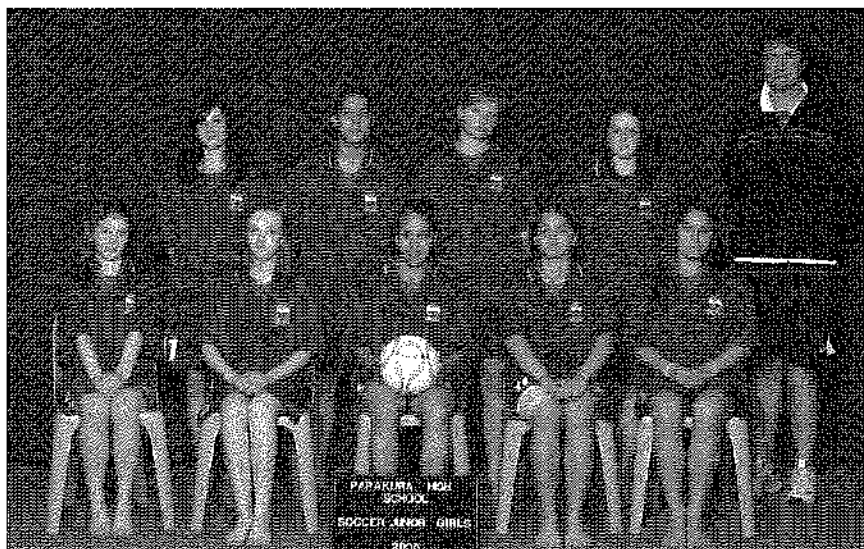
The girls' character was often tested, and they were up to the task, accepting dodgy refereeing decisions, less than fair play and strange incidents with a size 5 ball.

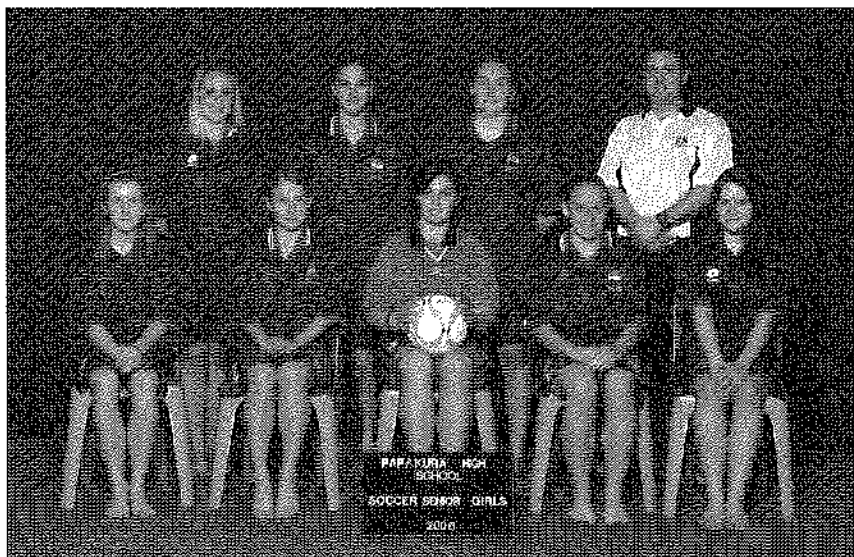

loss of 2 key players meant we lost this game in the final few minutes which was disappointing.

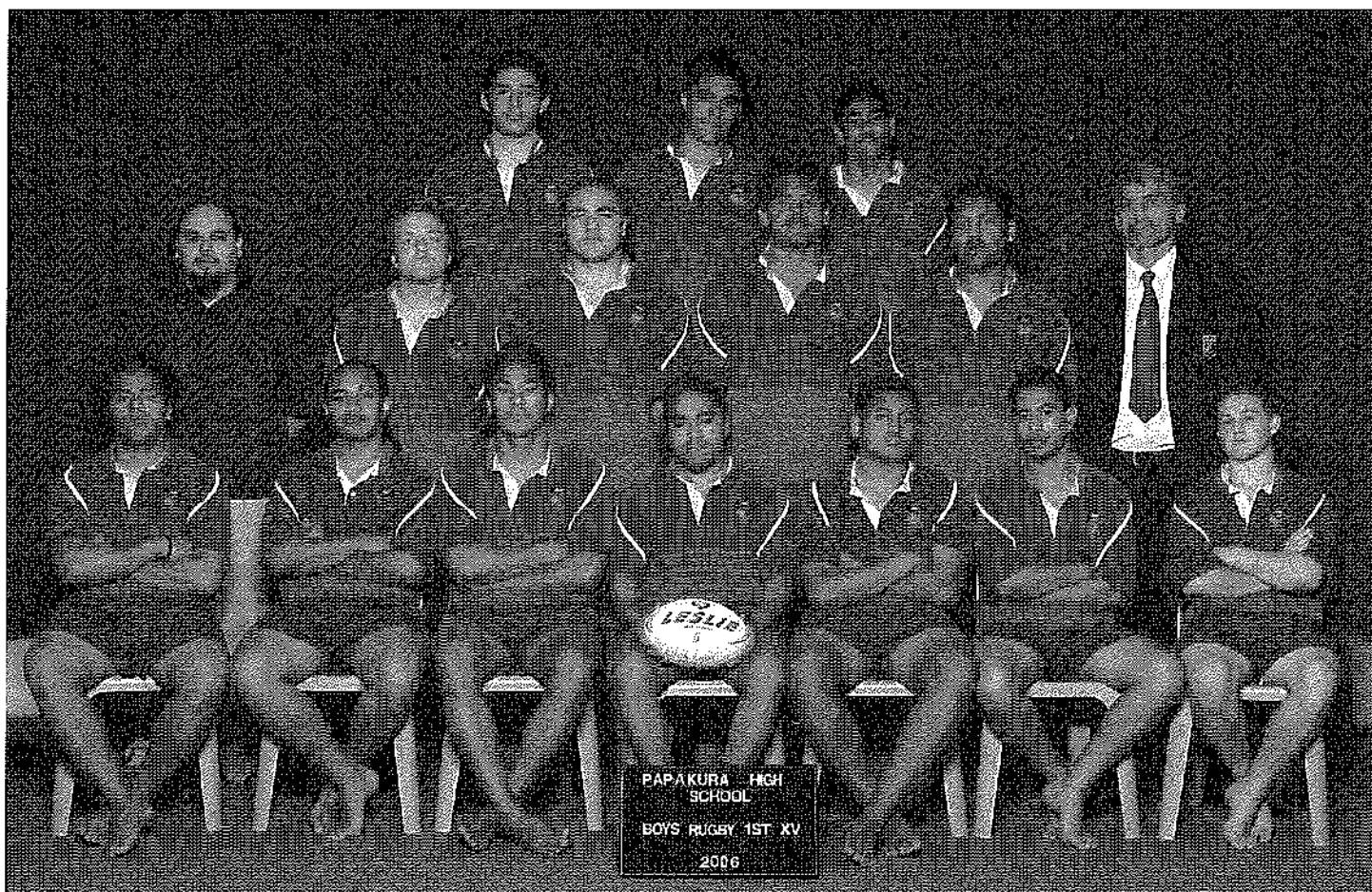

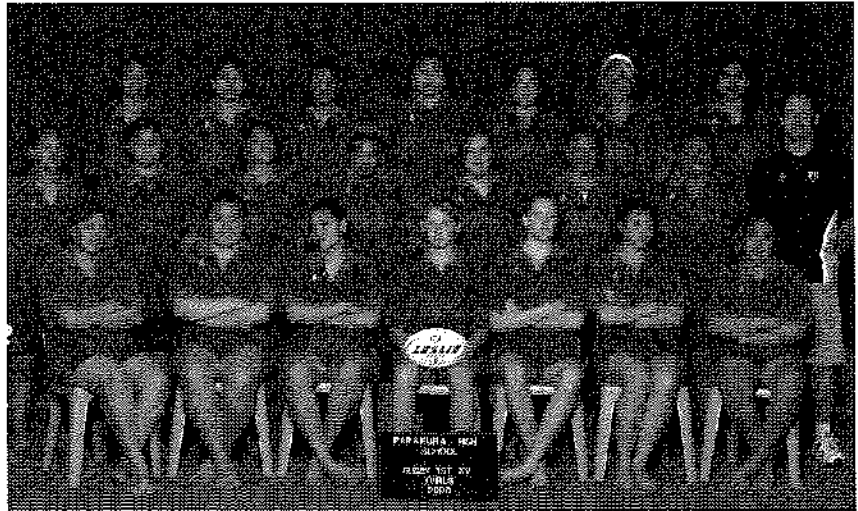
RUGBY REPORT 2006

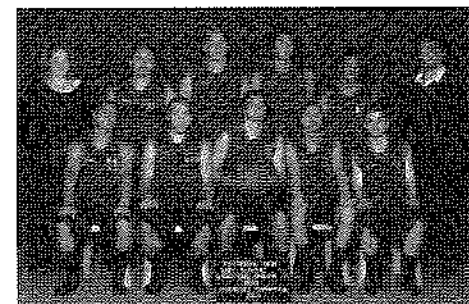

The team consists of year 10 and 11's and are mostly self-coached. The players are, Jesse Albrett, Dennis



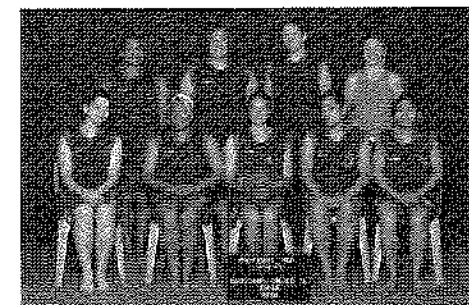
