Sports Academy

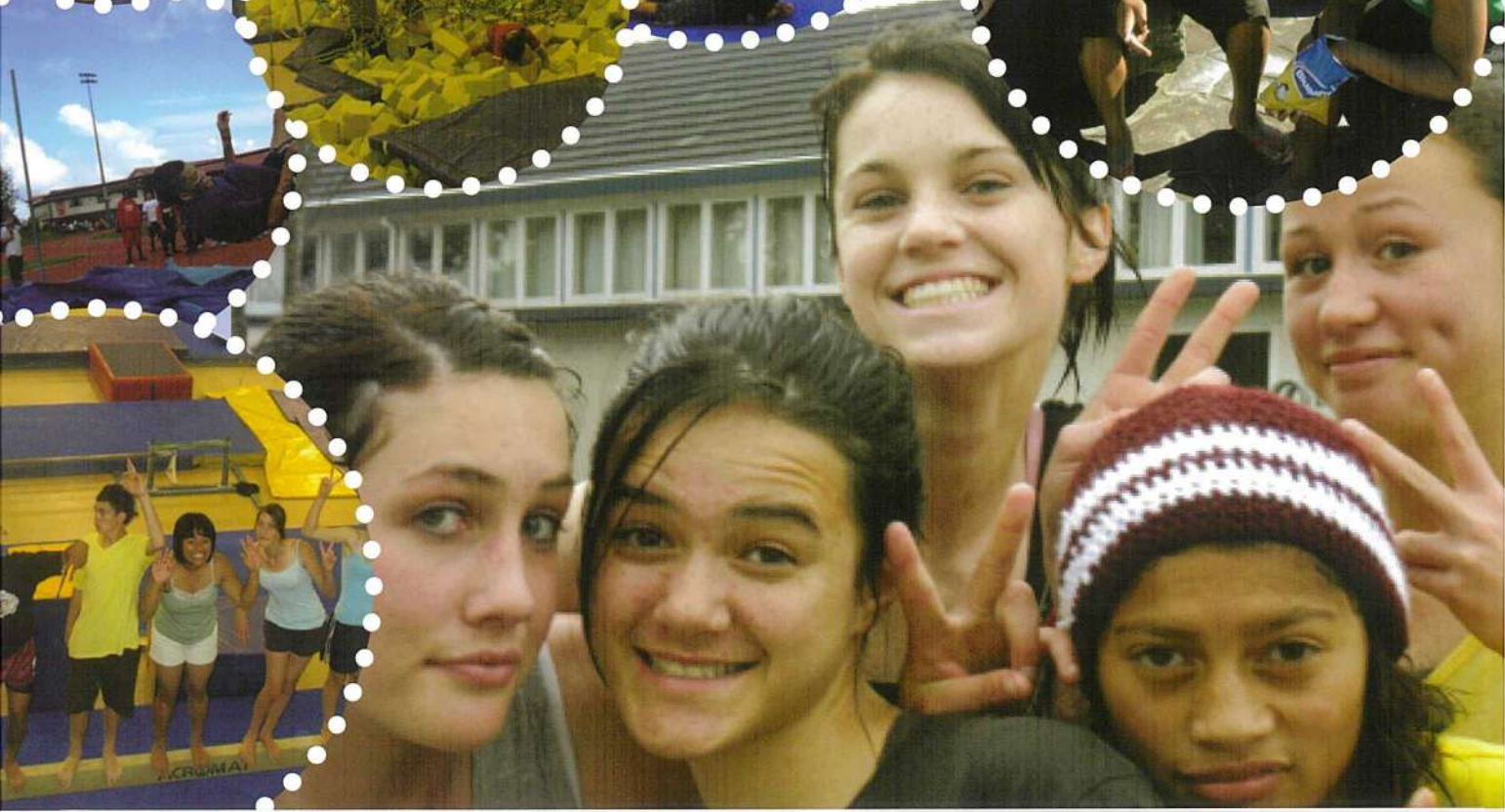
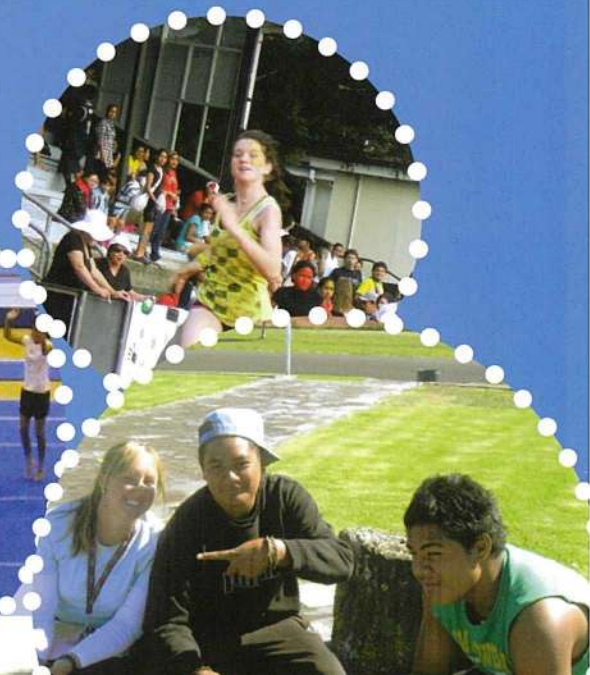
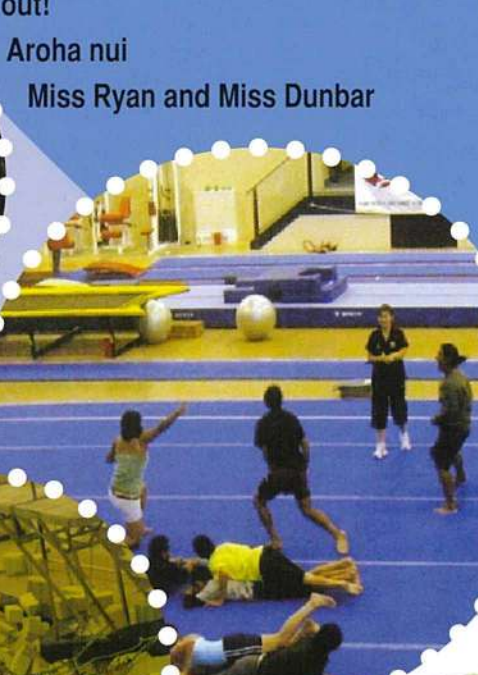
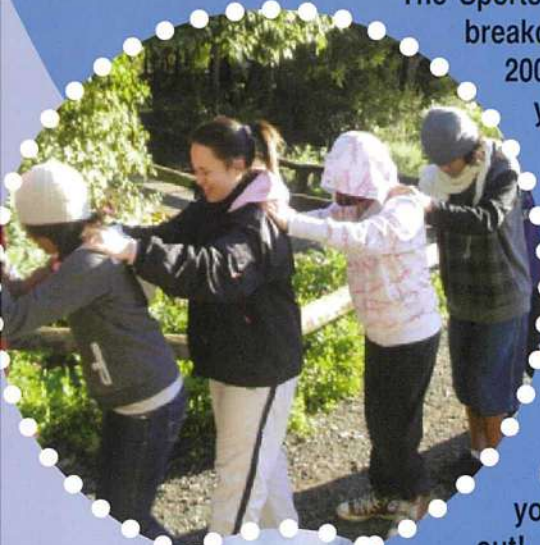

This game was point for point the whole way and we lost our lead in the dying seconds as Fairfield kept their cool and converted on their foul shots, final score 71 – 68 Fairfield won. Day two we were up against Church College (a favourite to win Nationals this year) the boys have had a lot of practice playing against basketball giants this year in the Premiere grade so we managed to adapt our style of game and played slow, controlled and calm which worked well, we were even leading in the first quarter. 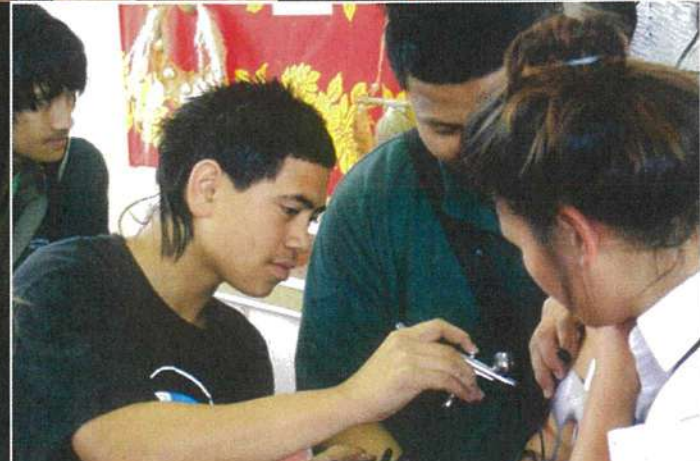
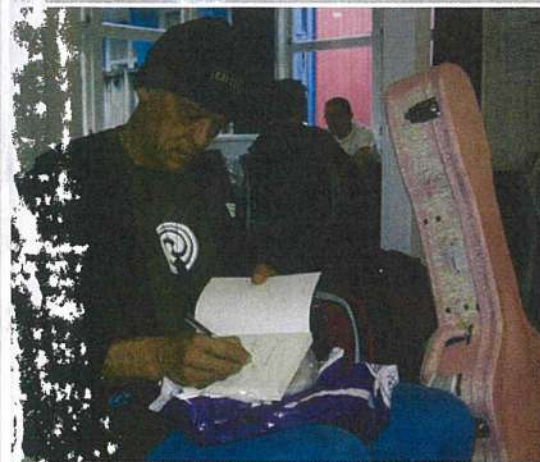
Along with the 5 Level 3 subjects this able student is studying Physics by correspondence for her 6th subject.
