






# SQUASH TEAMS

As the finals drew near the team that had grown together as a family had their last team talk. Messages of luck and encouragement were passed on as we slowly marched off into no mans land.




An interschool competition was also held on Saturday mornings with a good number of 6 teams entered from Papakura High School.



#### **GIRLS HOCKEY**


Girls hockey had an extremely successful year this year with both the 1st and 2nd IX teams winning their graded competitions.




## SPECIAL OLYMPICS REPORT
