Finally we would like to thank the young men Mr. Jones, Mr. Dell, and also Mr. Rangihuna who supported us and who owe us money!

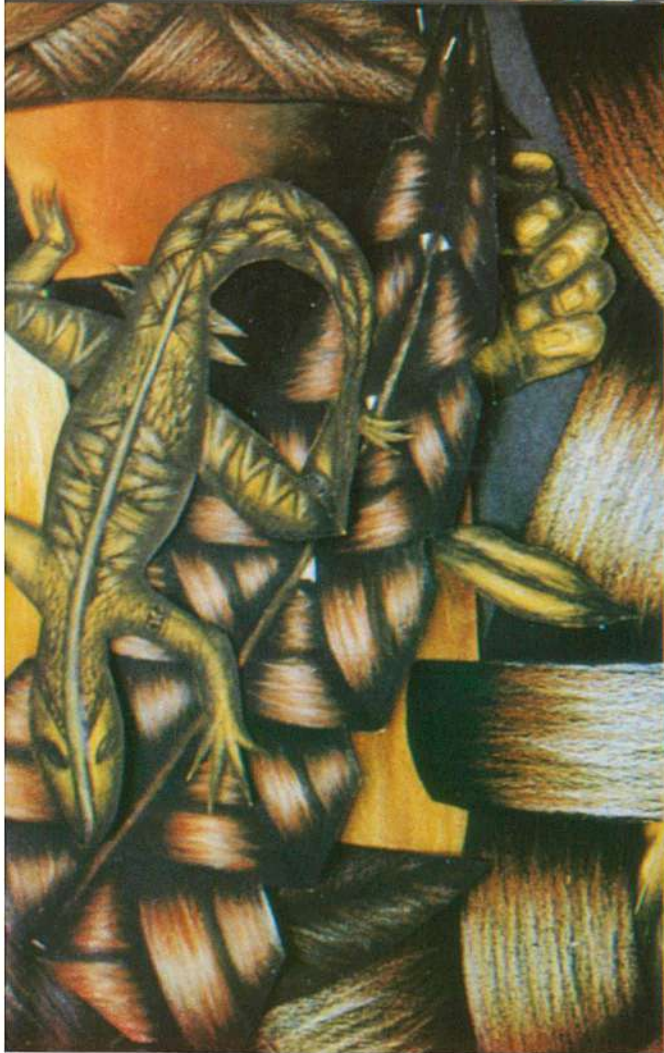

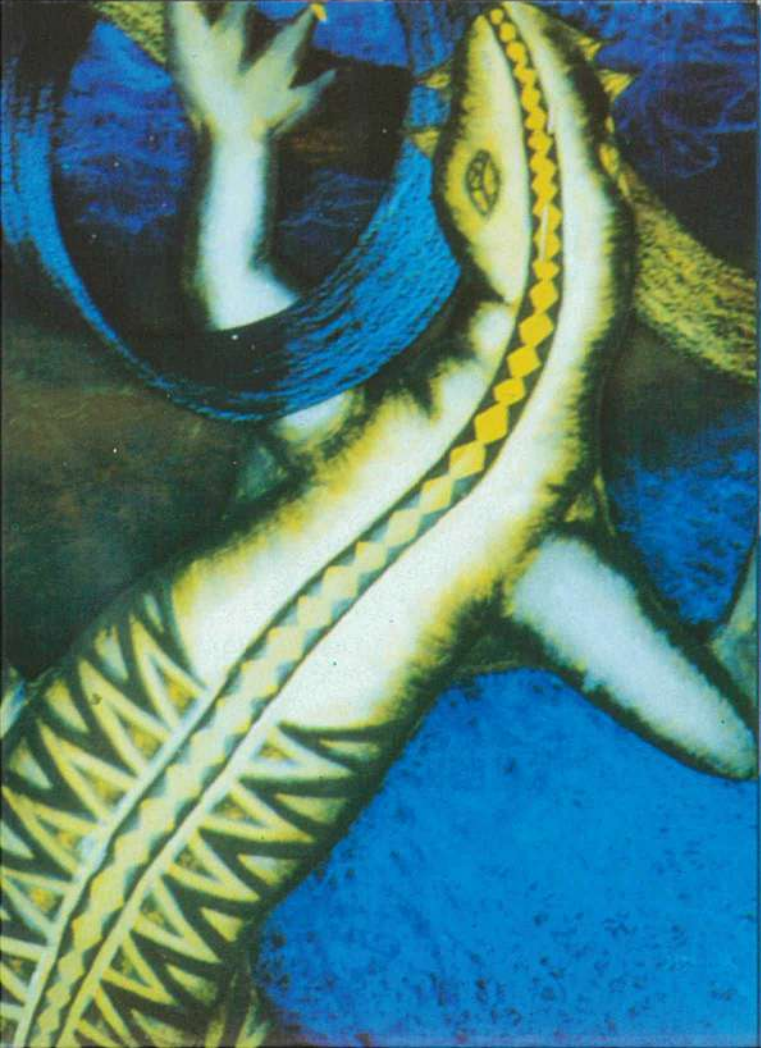
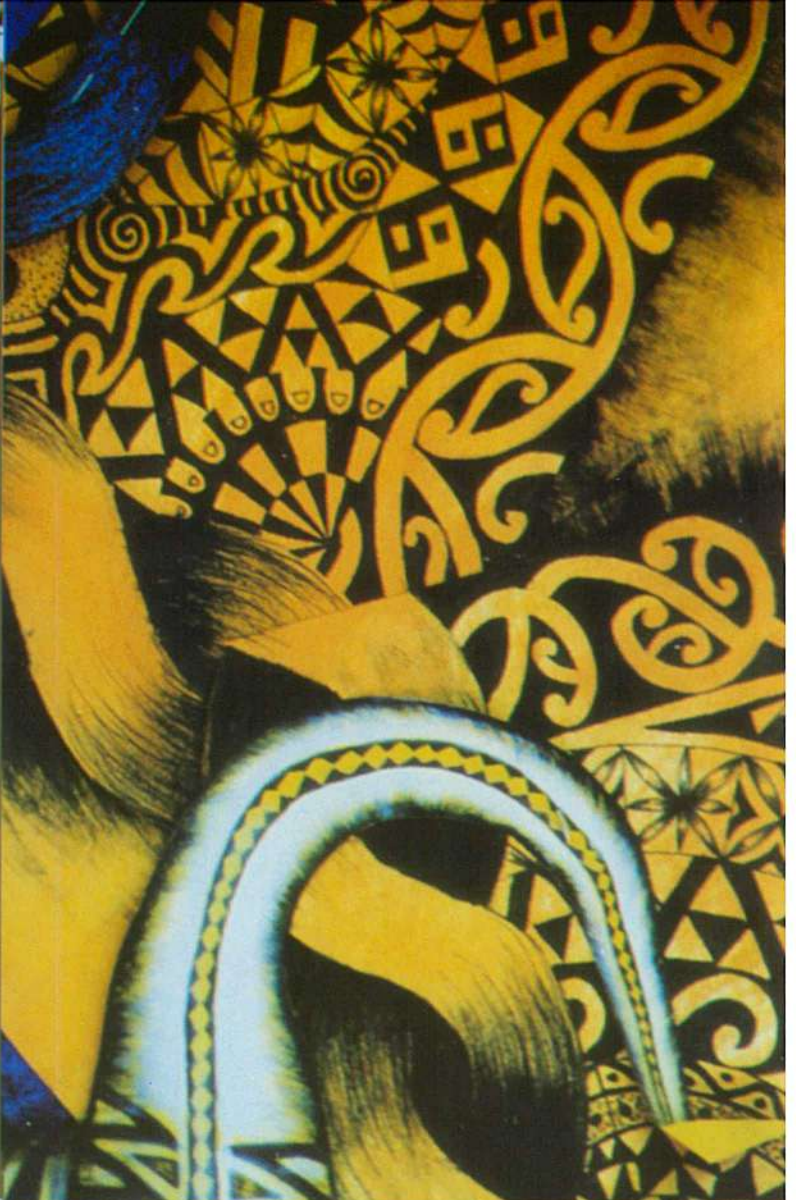
SENIOR GIRLS VOLLEYBALL

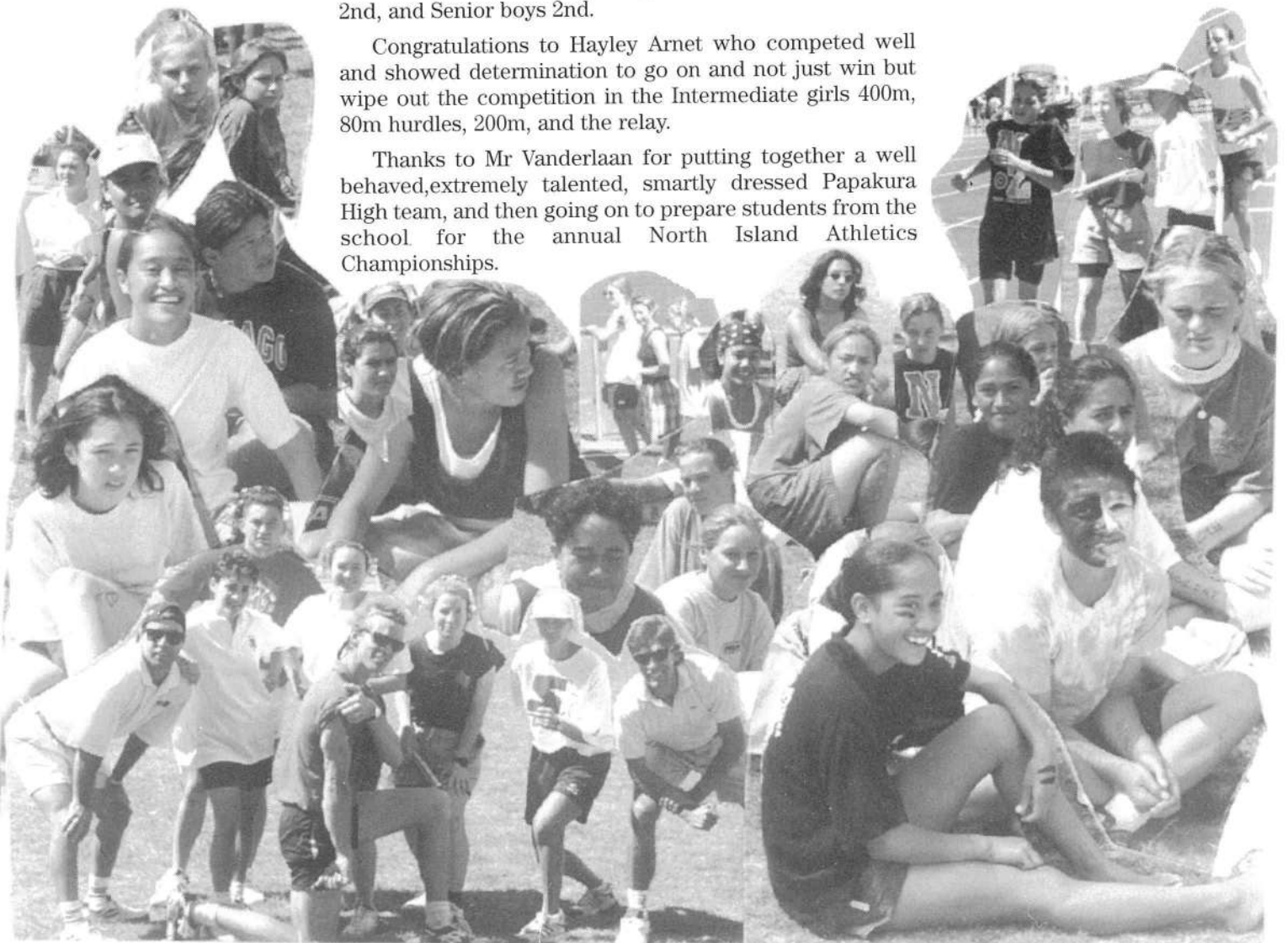
MANUKAU ATHLETICS 1996

In the future we hope to extend our studies on Bellbirds and other ecology in the ranges. This survey will be an ongoing project for the society. We hope to provide results which will be shown in publications such as this.

INTERACT

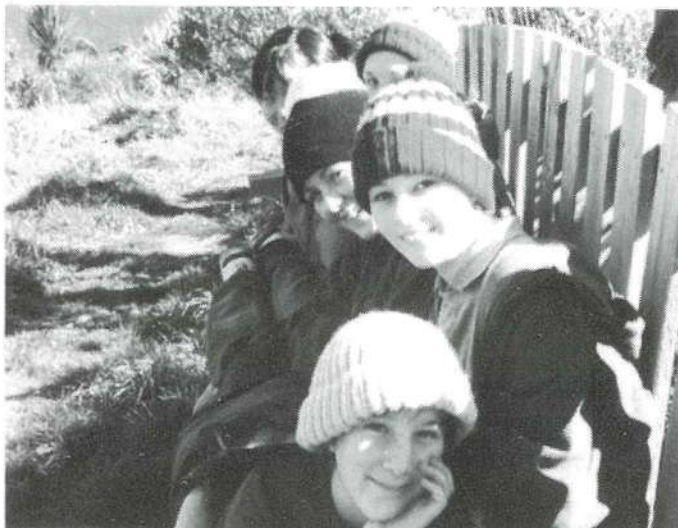
This year was Interact's third year at Papakura High. It was also one of its most successful.

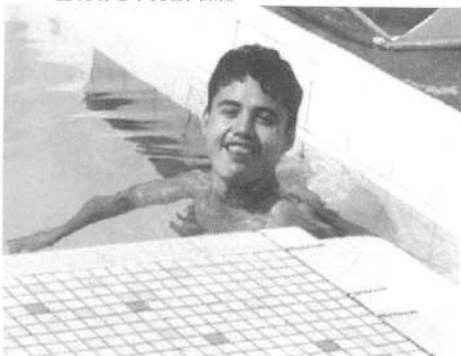

Apart from a few students that have left half way through the year. Mr. McDougal believes the majority have achieved the original goals which were set.

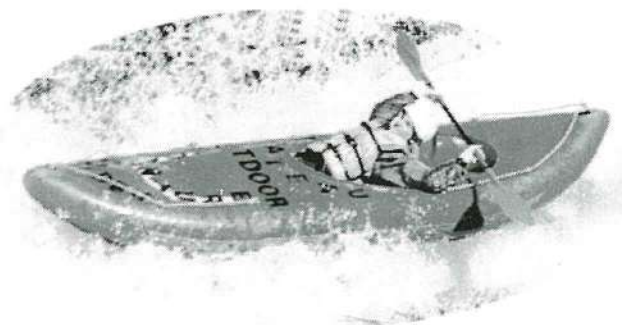

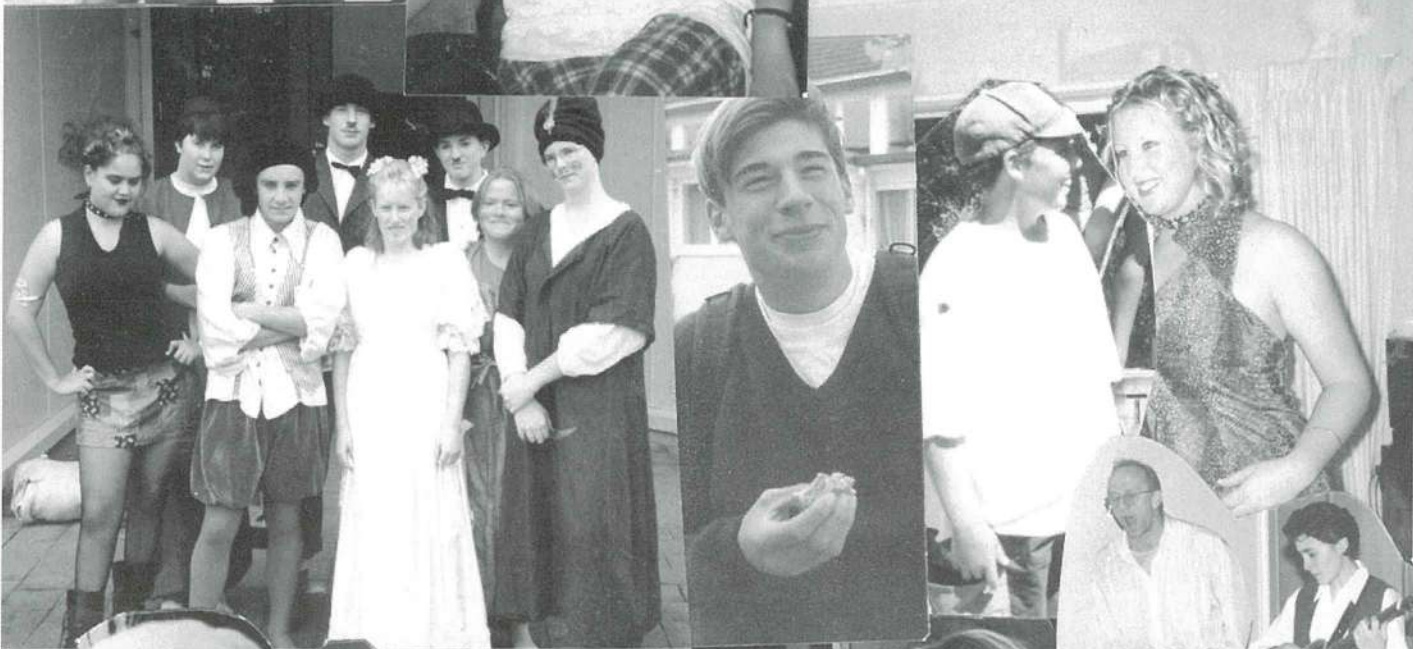
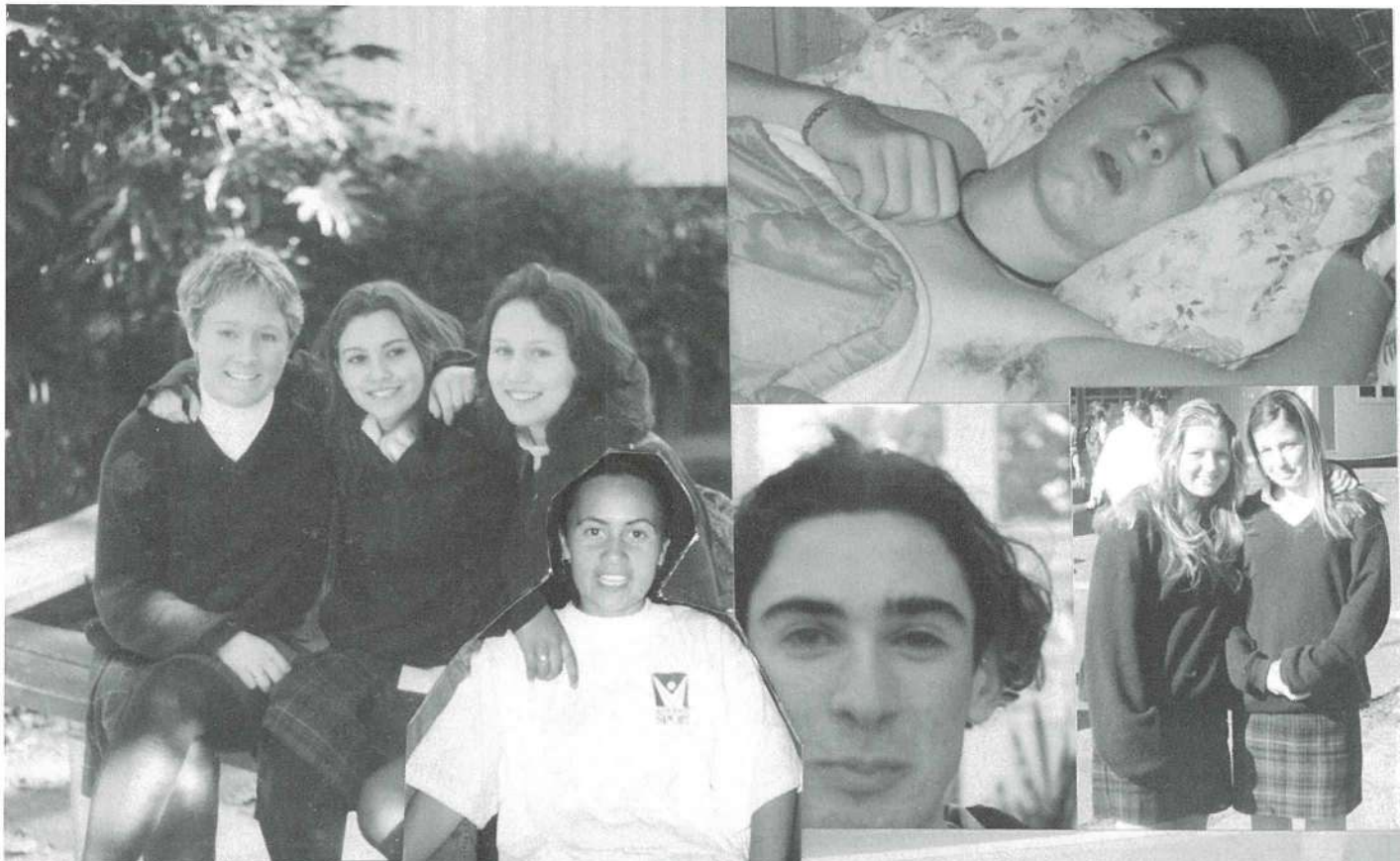


SPIRIT OF ADVENTURE 1996

Maths Olympiad

Lyndsay Smith 6e spent the Easter holidays at Wanaka in the South Island working with students from other schools at a Maths Olympiad Camp. 10 students now are doing Special Maths Problems to see if they are eligible for next years camps (January and Easter Camps). From these Camps A Maths Olympiad Team is selected to represent the country in an international Mathematical Olympiad Training Camp.

Junior Mathematically Able:

Each year students in the third form get the opportunity to spent part of their school holidays doing Mathematics at the Auckland College of Education. This is the training ground for students who may become part of the Maths olympiad team. This year Brent Laing of 3s has been offered a place, after proving his ability in a test, which was sat by 12 of our top third formers.

MATHEMATICS COMPETITIONS:

National Bank Competition: This is for students in form 3 - form 5 . This year we had 30 competitors, with Vicki Banks of 3u winning a Certificate of Merit.

Australian Maths Competition: This Competition is for all levels of the school. This year we had 75 Competitors, but as yet we have not received any results.

Senior Maths Competition: This Competition is for the 6th and 7th formers only. Only two students achieved a high enough mark to go on the the next level of competition. They were Catherine Parnell 7e and Lyndsay Smith 6e. We have no further results at this stage.

In the middle of May, our class began a statistical investigation involving paper helicopters. We chose to do our investigation on what would be the ideal rotor blade length and what would be the best added body weight in paper clips.

Our Maths/Form teacher Mrs Parnell also informed us of the possibility of extending our set investigation so that it would be able to be entered in the Auckland Mathex Competition.

To begin with we drew up and cut out the necessary number of paper helicopters (21) and carried out our time trials from the rafters of Melissa's garage. We graphed our results and drew conclusions.

We concluded that the best overall helicopter rotor length was 100 mm making the ratio between body length and rotor length 1:1. The best added body weight was one paper clip, however the above when combined was not the overall best. The actual best combination was one paper clip added to the helicopter with a 1.4:1 ratio between the rotor and the body.

Presentation wasn't really hard because it was well specified in the guidelines given by our teacher. We decided to display this on a three piece wooden board with a painted helicopter as our centre.

We believe all our work over the past three weeks was worth while and we would like to thank Statistics New Zealand for their sponsorship.
