
Girls Team 2 came 2nd out of ten teams (Matilda Parker, Michelle de Graaf, Justine Kells and Tracey Jackson).

### LIBRARY



We welcomed Marina Hapeta as Library Assistant and Jacqui Baker as Librarian. They are looking forward to getting to know all the students.


The library was lucky to win a multi-media computer and we now have two CD machines. These are a great extra for research now that the students are finding it harder to play the games. We await the INTERNET!



# CULTURAL INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

This year we have had thirty eight students who have come from overseas without their parents to study at Papakura High School. The majority are from South Korea, Taiwan and Japan.

Students can join a class called Cultural Studies which involves learning about New Zealand and trips around the country.

The 1996 trip to the South Island during the October holidays was a real adventure trek. We joined the ASSE (exchange students) tour which was filled with thrillseekers. To keep up, all the students bungy jumped and Mrs Parker, Keiko Ohira and Julia Cho even did a tandem parachute jump from 10,000 feet. 




# POLYNESIAN CULTURAL GROUP


Our other contestant Tristan Wati finished in the top half.

# PAPAKURA MAORI **CULTURE GROUP**




The group participated in the ASB Maori and Pacific Islands Cultural Festival, non-competitive section. It was a polished and confident performance from such a new group.


