

# SPORTS COORDINATORS REPORT

This position was created with the special funding by the Board of Trustees in 1993 with several objectives in mind. Firstly to coordinate all the school sports teams and to support their coaches and managers. Secondly to promote sporting involvement amongst students, and thirdly to promote the concepts of "Fair-Play" and enjoyment in all sports. It has been a good year for participation in school sports teams. The Wednesday afternoon sports activities programme allowed staff to organize, administer and train teams in school time. This has led to a large number of students being involved in playing for the school.

The main growth areas were, Tennis for the summer sports and Rugby in the winter sports. Mrs Parnell and her assisting teachers have built up a big and competitive squad of student tennis players who are achieving out-standing results in the inter-school competitions. Under new MASTER-IN-CHARGE-OF-RUGBY, Mr Reidy, we saw an expansion this year to six teams with the likelihood of fielding seven next season. The Town vs Country challenges and barbecue at the seasons end were a great success and a fine way to wrap up the season. With a strong under 15 team this year and many of last years 1st XV returning next year, the school is looking forward to good things in rugby in 1994.

Netball had a mixed season with a dedicated group of teachers led by Mrs Parker struggling at times to field the required number of teams. If all the talented players in the school would support our teams in the next season, then Papakura High School will be able to field competitive teams in all divisions.

Boys hockey had trouble fielding a team early on but persistence by coach, Mr Rowsell, paid off and they finished the season with some good wins. The girls A hockey team won their division in the Auckland competition for the second season running and were ably supported by the B team. The boys 1st XI soccer team had a difficult season, but the 2nd XI, under new coach Mr Dolbear, were more successful in winning the C division. The girls soccer team also continued on their winning way by coming second in their competition.

The new sport of Dragon boat racing saw a stunning performance by a mixed team in term one, who were narrowly beaten into 2nd place in the finals of the Auckland regatta. The same team is already in training to win that event in 1994. Recognition must go to the hours of dedication put in by coach, Mr Rangihuna. Special mention must be made of the efforts of Mrs Deoki with her gymnastics, trampolining and tumbling teams. Papakura High School consistently fields the largest teams in these competitions and has achieved some outstanding results. Support from parent Mrs McKenzie and the co-operation with Jack Harry at the local community centre has also been important.

Many students are benefiting from the wide range of sporting opportunities available at Papakura High School. Staff are encouraged to get involved and take teams, but are sometimes frustrated in their efforts. Students can help by

## INDOOR CRICKET

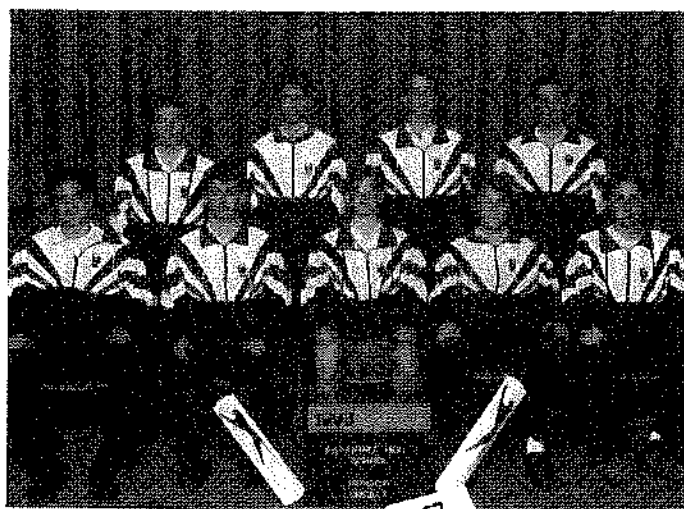

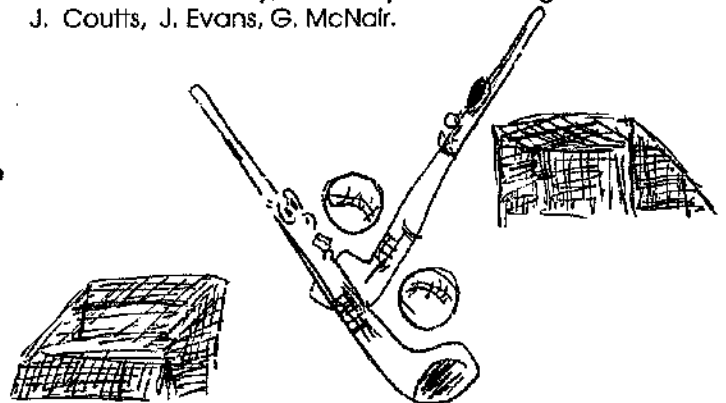

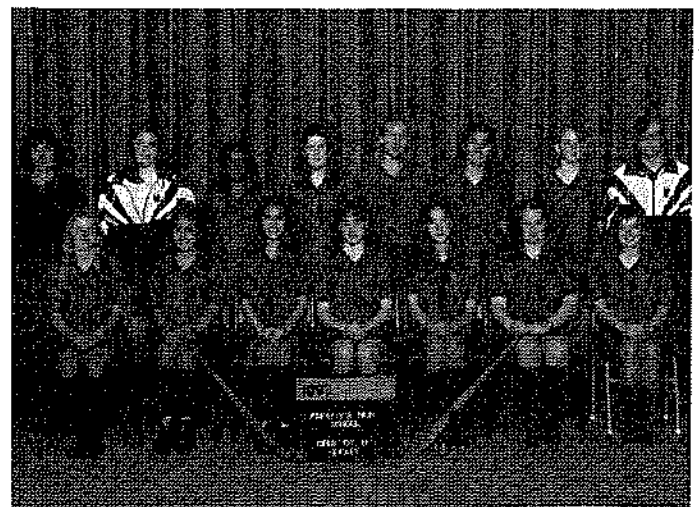


# GIRLS HOCKEY

## NETBALL

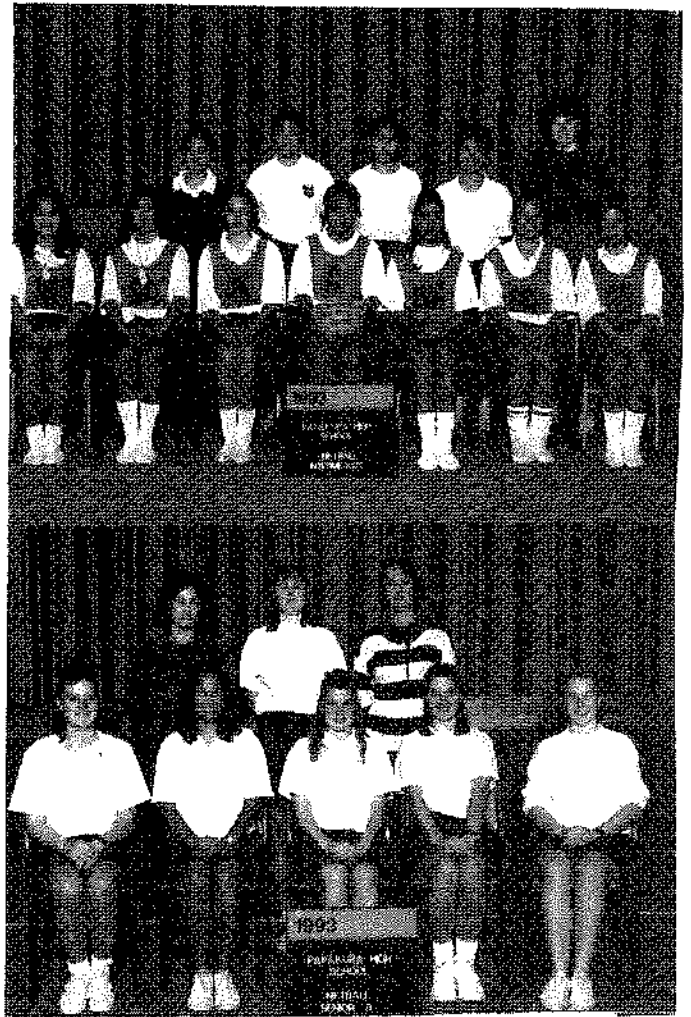

## BOYS 1ST XI SOCCER

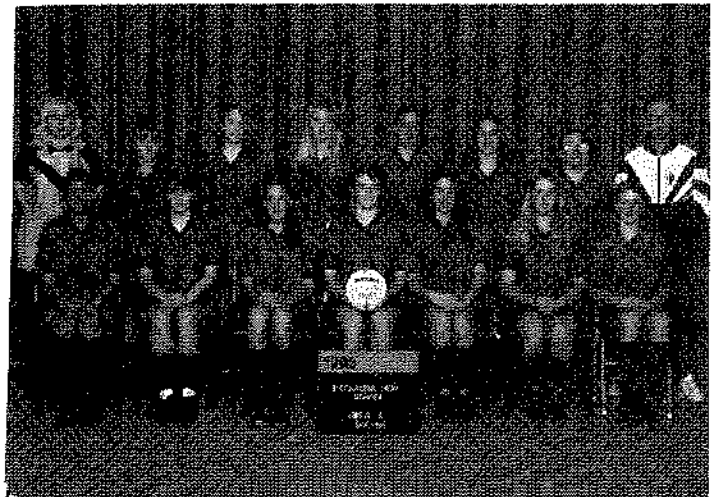
Due to last years successful season the season was promoted to the top division. In the early games they struggled against much better teams and suffered several big losses.

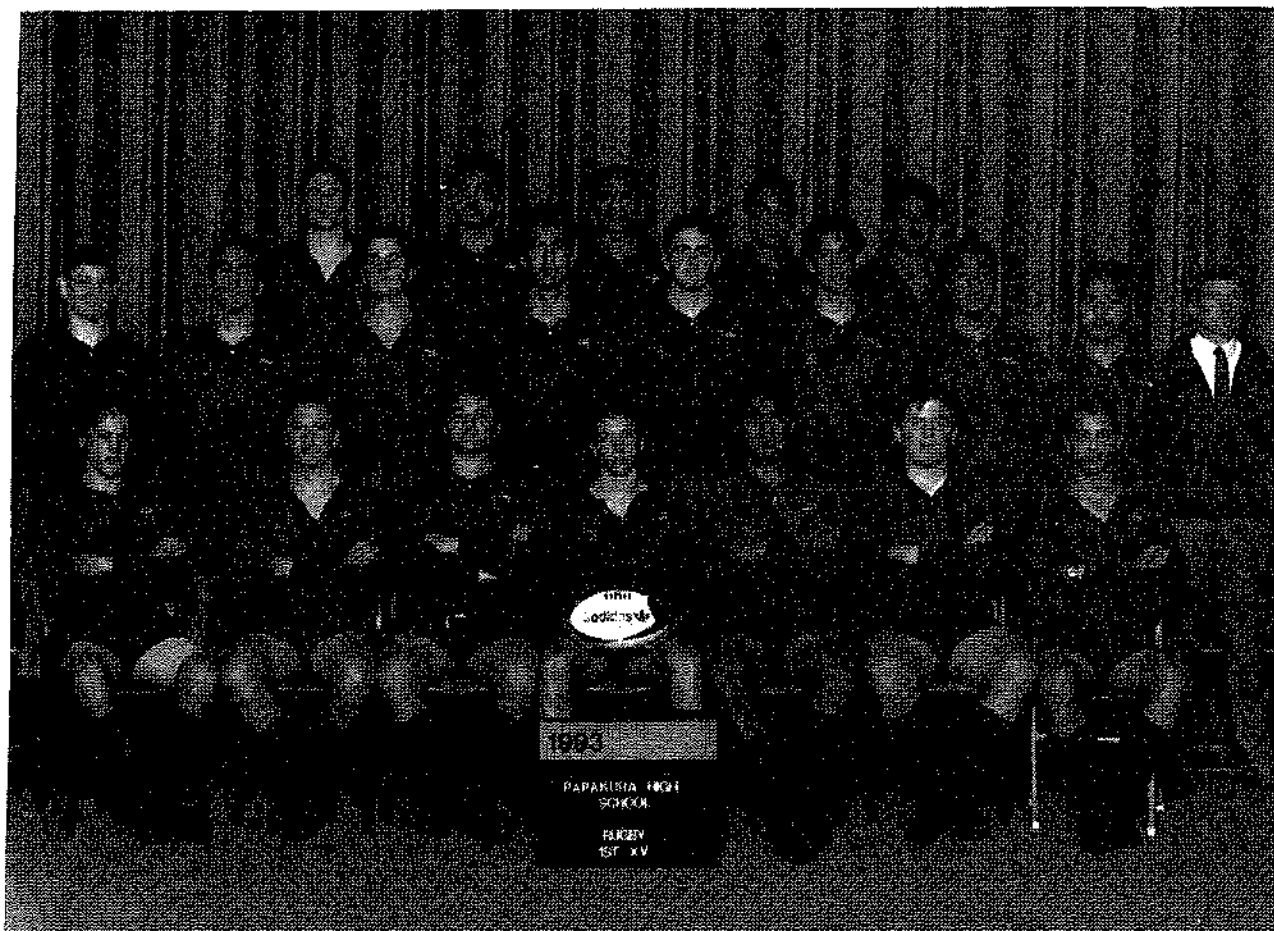

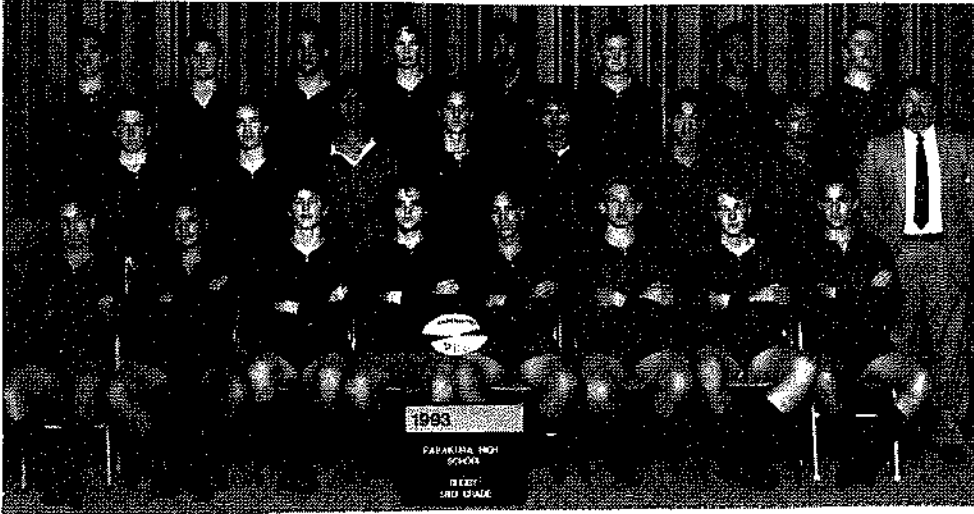

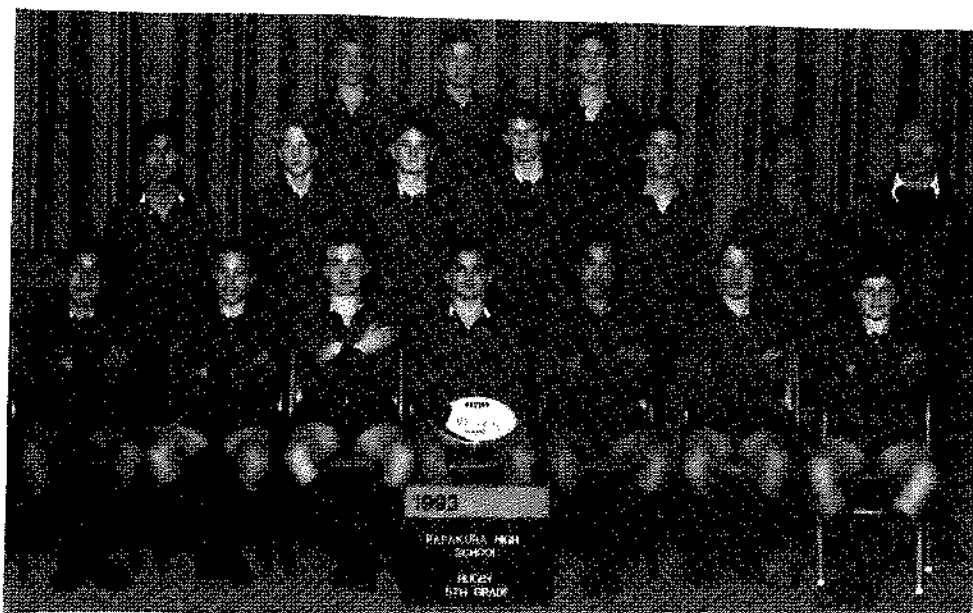

Overall Papakura finished 8th. The team would like to thank Mr Reidy and Mr Brewin for their coaching and their support.

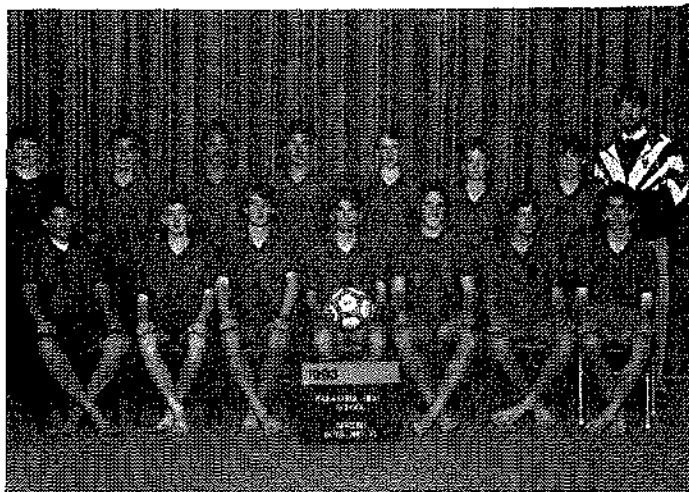

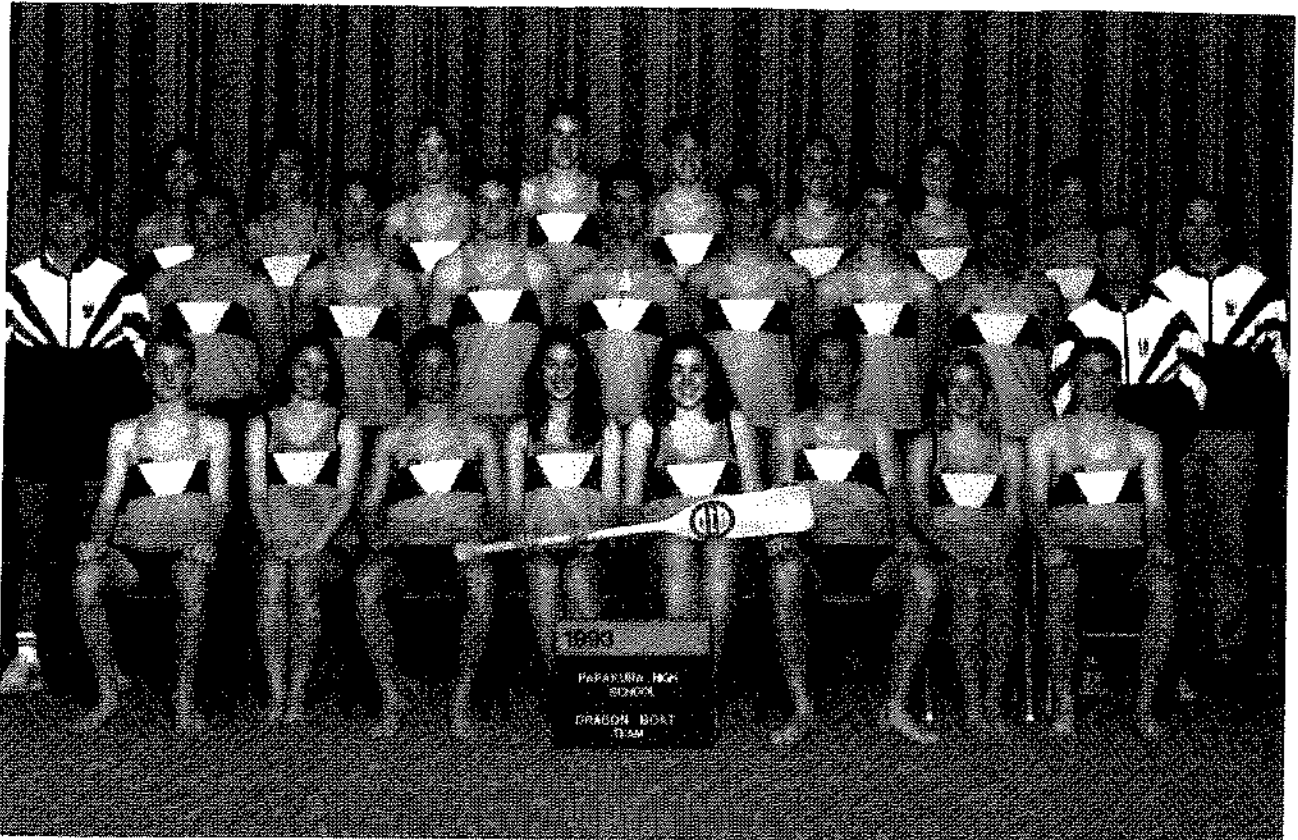
Niki Coningham will be defending her 1992 title from some stiff competition while the boys title won last year by her brother Richard, is up for grabs.

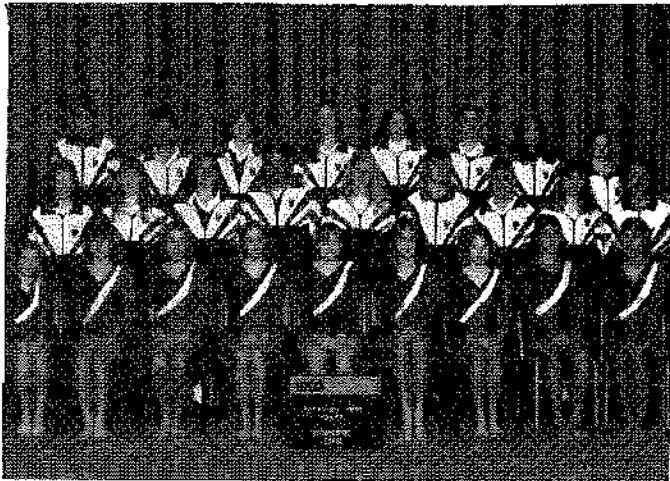

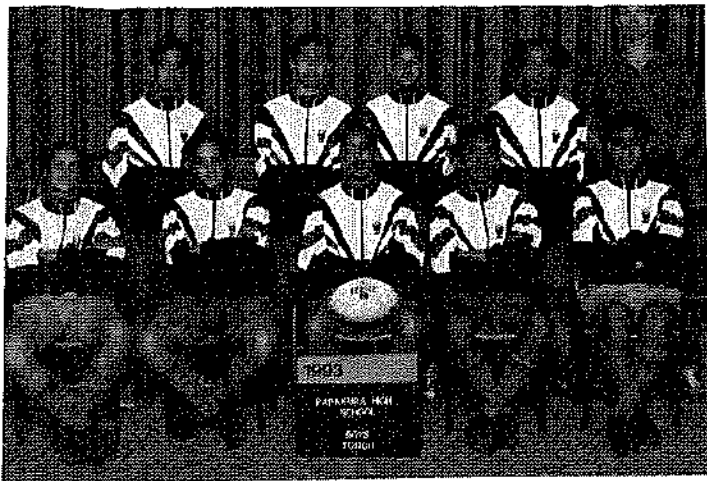
# PAPAKURA HIGH SCHOOL TOUCH TEAM

The girls lost 2 games and won 1 in the round robin play to go through to the plate round where they were knocked out.

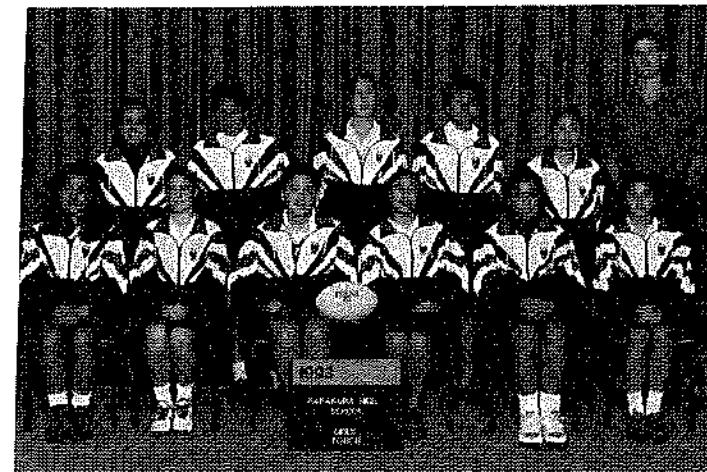

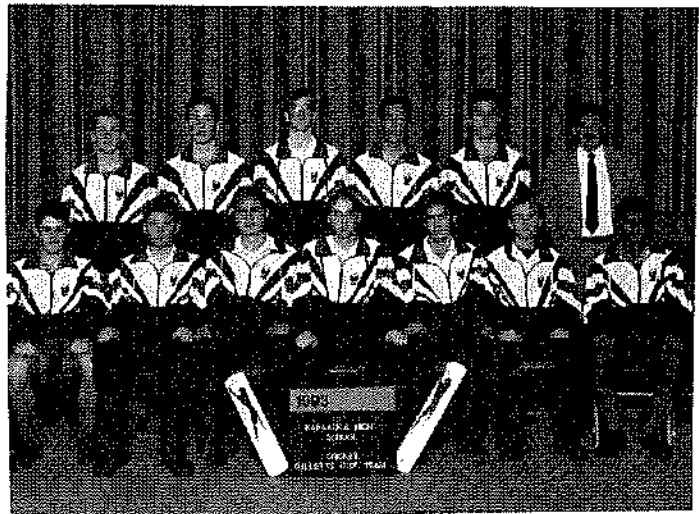

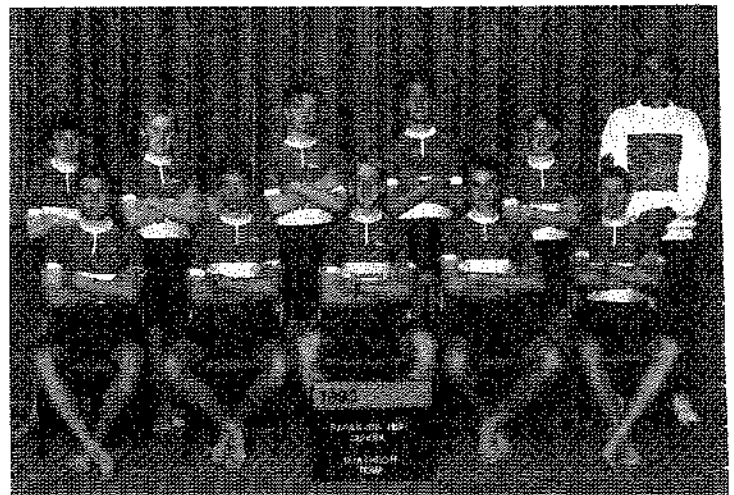
## MULTI-SPORTS

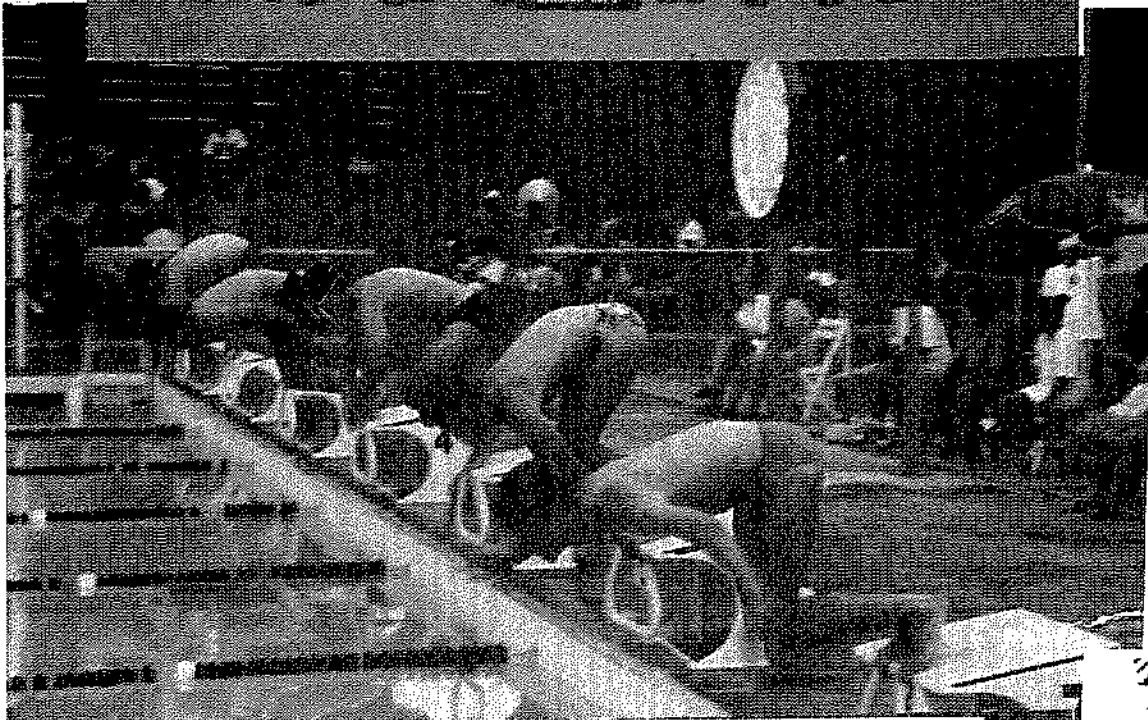

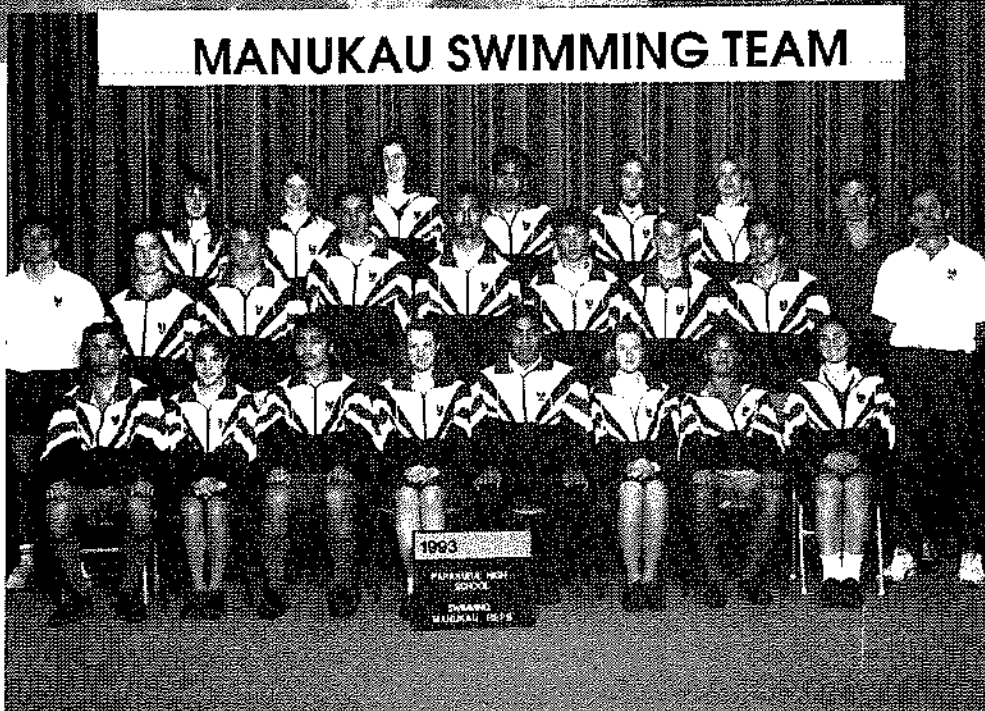

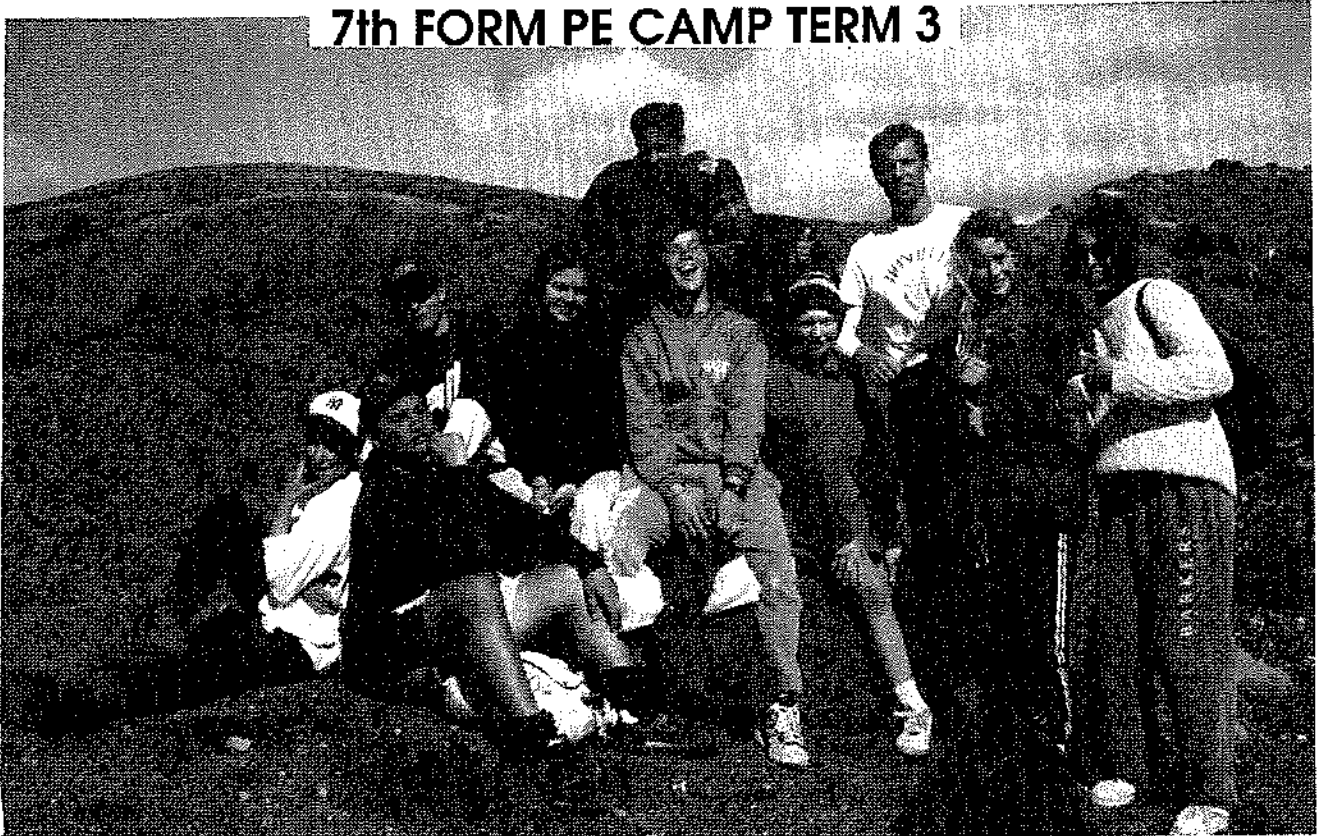

### DAY FOUR

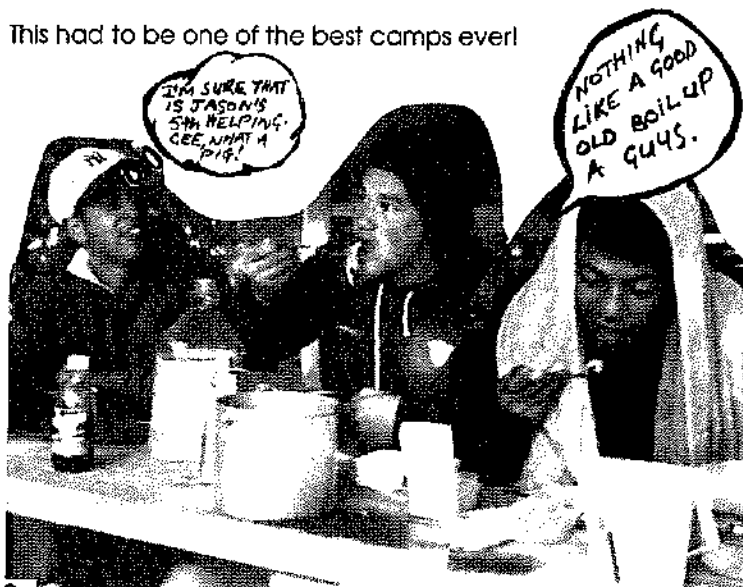
