Let no one spoil these well-deserved moments of triumph.

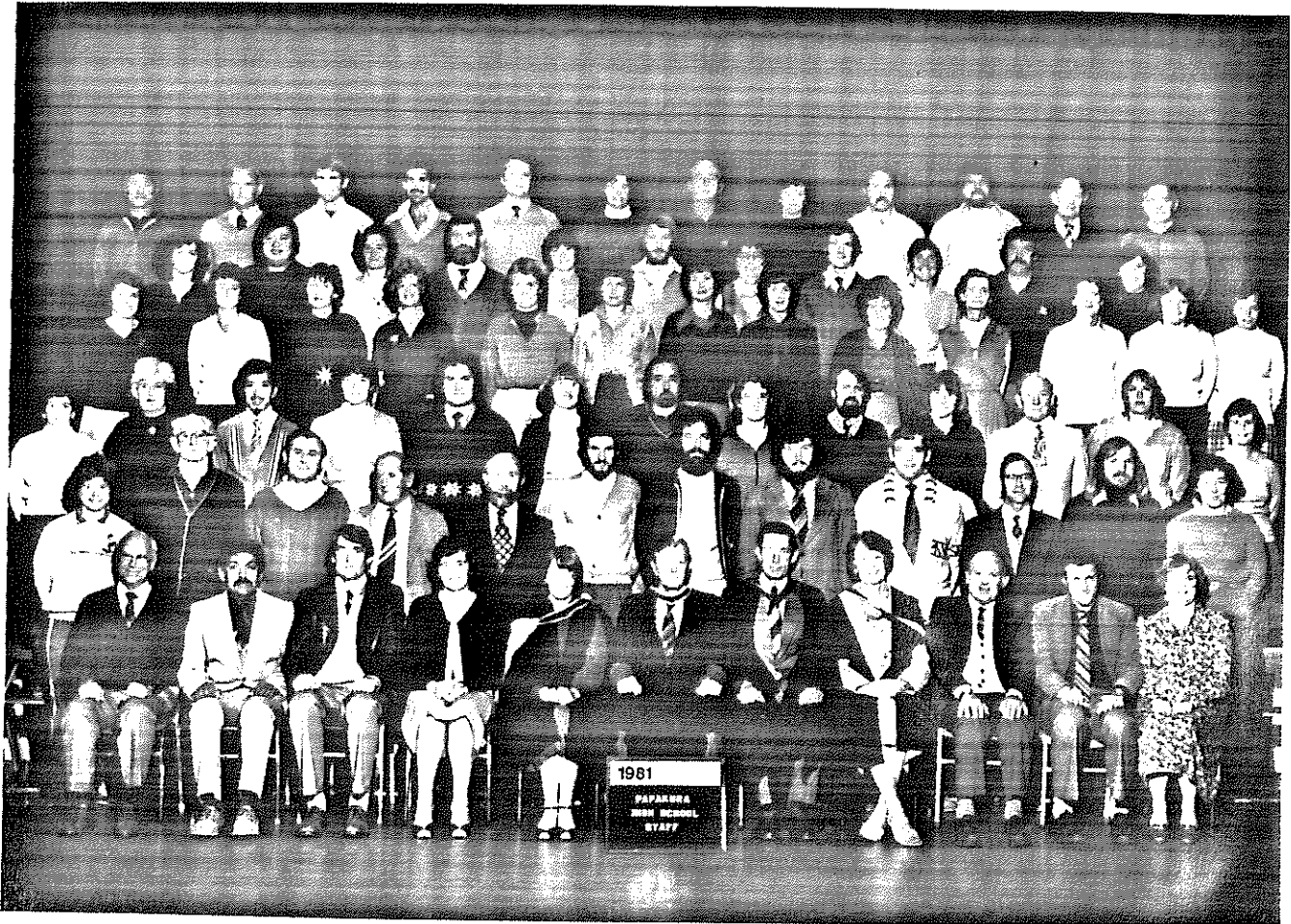

1981 School Drama Production

Mr Cocks began work on 'Ned Kelly' early on in 1981. He made some changes to the script: editing bits, adding bits and cutting some rather nasty words out. He then began auditioning a cast and enlisted the help of other staff members to aid in the production.

He roped in Mrs Holland to help with costumes and many other things. Mr Bishop was in charge of lights (and a fine job he did). Mr Latrobe did sound effects and was in charge of the backstage crew. First performance rapidly approached and a small portion of the play was performed in front of the school which was well received. A couple of rehearsals on the weekend before the performance were thrown in for good measure and then... Our Stage Debut!

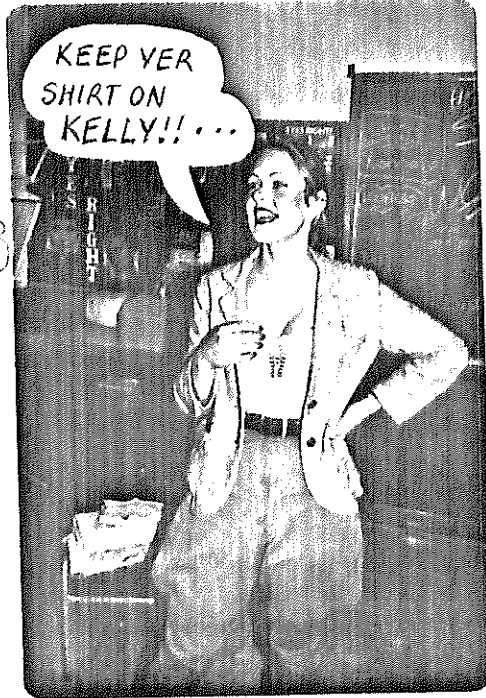
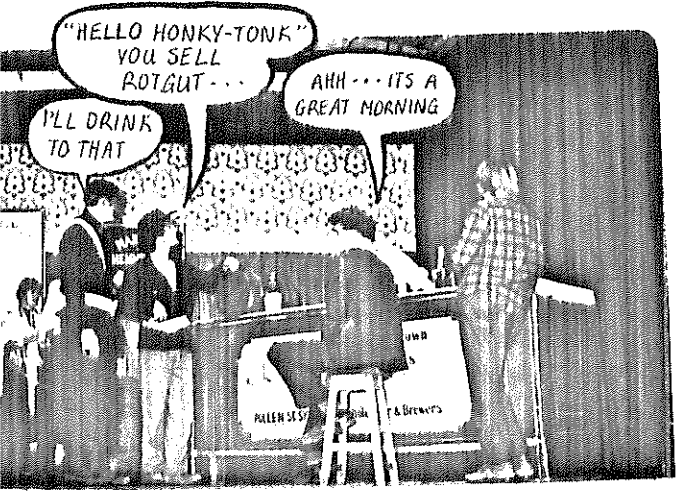
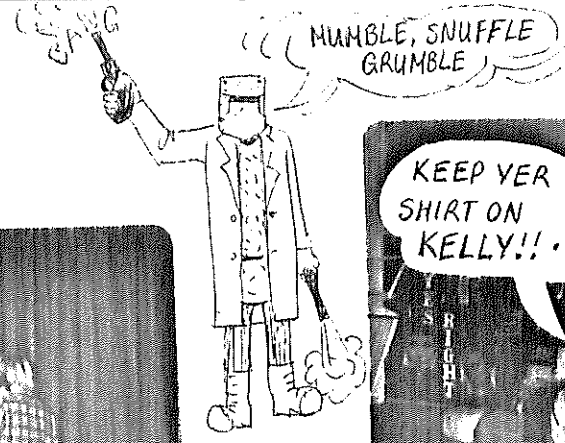
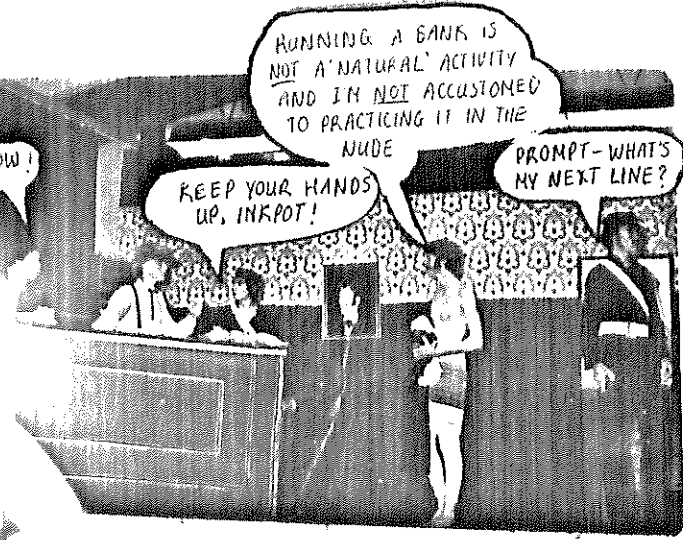
All things considered it went quite well. A few lines were fluffed and a number of pages of script were completely missed out but the audience didn't notice.

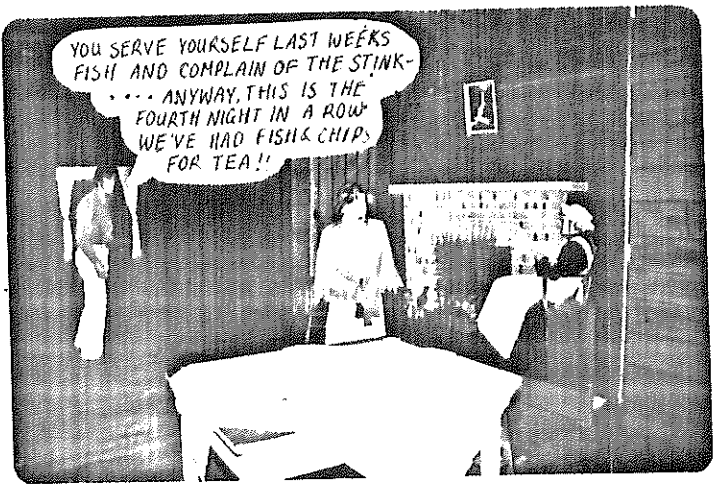
Finally it was all over. Most people celebrated by getting severely under-the-table or other socially acceptable acts.

 spoke on "Graffiti".

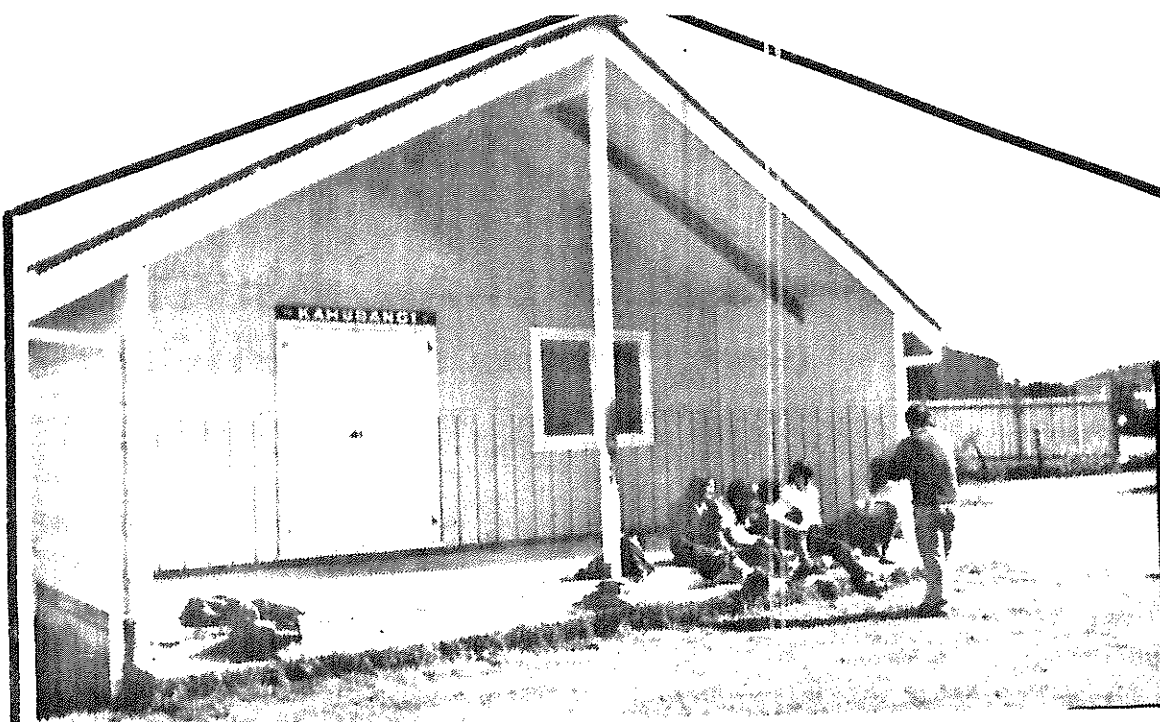
Deirdre Sicely, speaking on

Some carving needs to be done to decorate it, and the school and local Maori community are looking at ways of getting the work done.

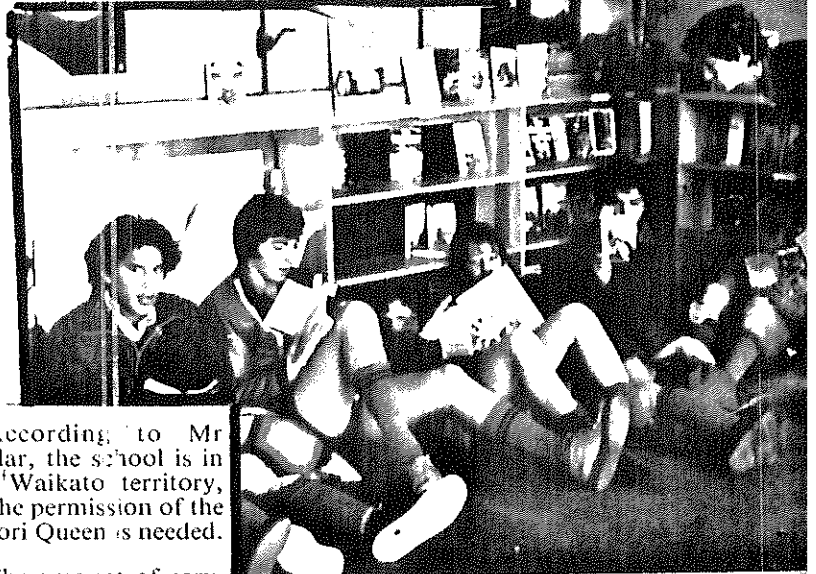
The deputy principal of the school, Mr Jim

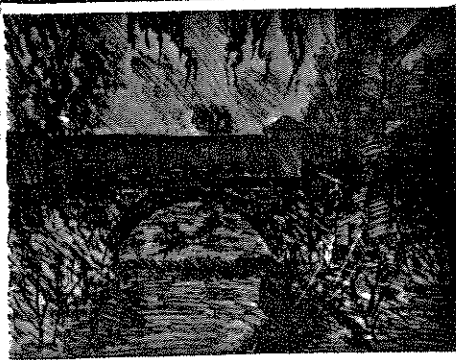
JUNIOR SPEECH COMPETITION - PAPAKURA HIGH SCHOOL
