




NETBALL 3B





What remains for the manager/coach to add but his thanks to the ever enthusiastic captain Gary Franklin. Well led Gary!



The sport requires only a map, a compass and the will to find check points hidden in the countryside. The course at Waharau is not too demanding and ideal for beginners.



BOYS SOFTBALL




On Wednesday, February 27, the Manukau Counties Secondary Softball Tournament was held at Prince Edward Park, Papakura.


A TEENAGE SUICIDE?



PS Dark sunglasses are included in his luggage - please ensure he wears then as his pupils are dazzling.




