The Ball Committee – for great ideas, collaboration, decision making, fundraising and creativity!

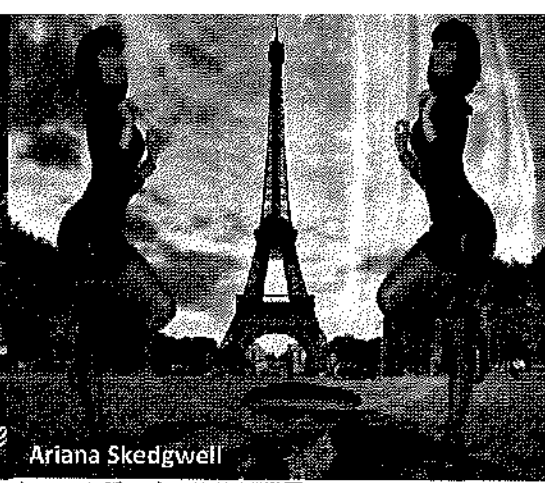

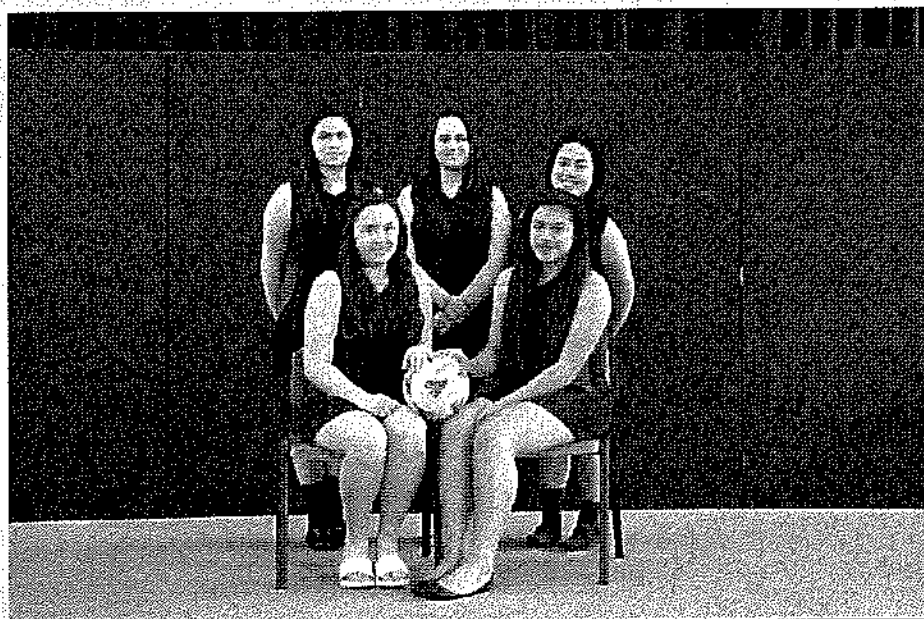

COUNTIES MANUKAU BOYS & GIRLS HOCKEY

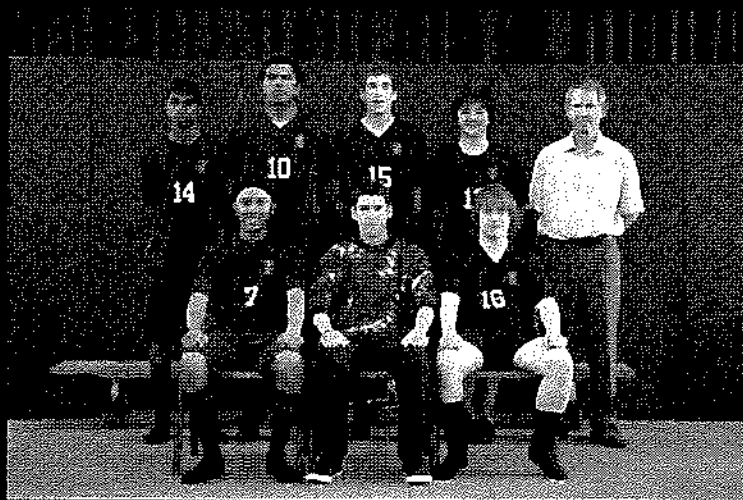

The game wasn't over yet as the team lost their midfield dynamo, Tiana Atiga, with a broken leg. However, the team managed to hold on and went into the last game on maximum points.

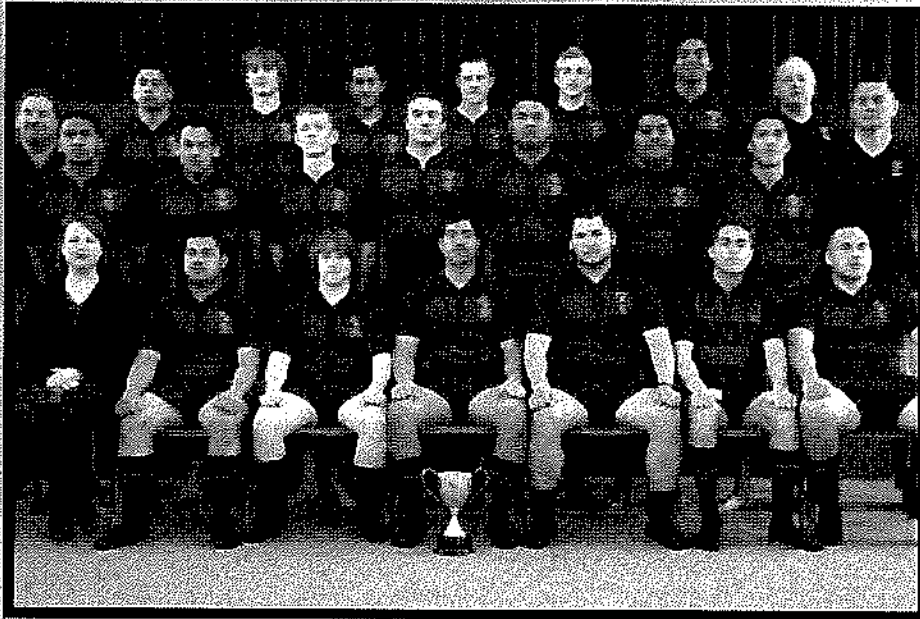
The final game against Strathallan was won 1-0 and this meant that the girls had triumphed for the second year in a row at this level.

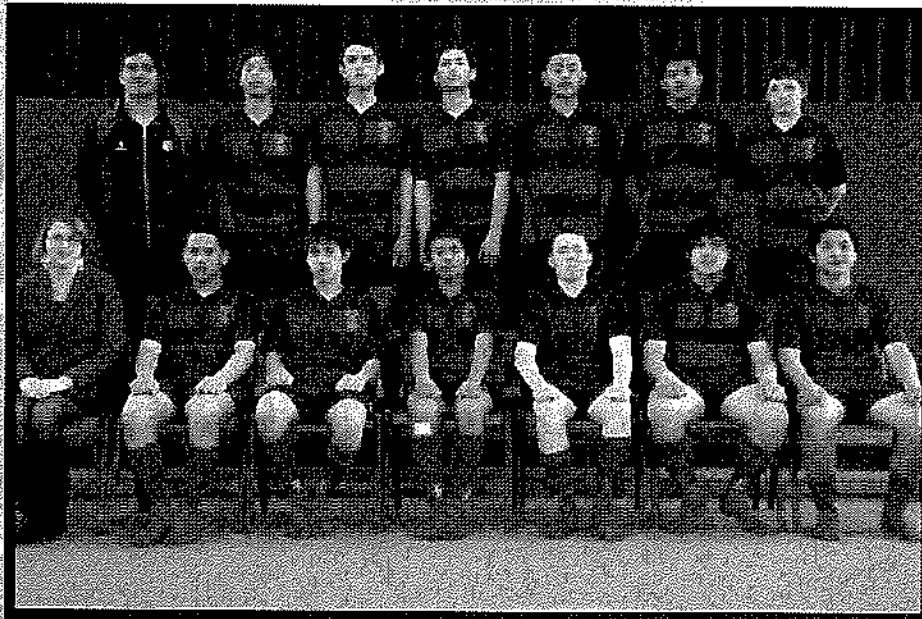
