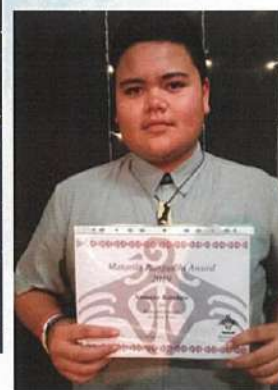

new, challenge ourselves and to really enjoy the beautiful outdoors that we are lucky to be surrounded by here in New Zealand.





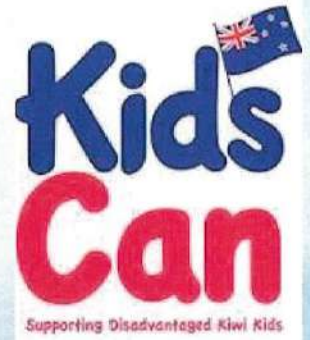
