

The question was asked as to how the lockdown will affect NCEA achievement.

The lockdown last year was earlier so it was easier to make up credits. However, it is going to be difficult to make up for the lost time this year. We will struggle to get the levels of achievement targeted this year due to the timeframe, despite the increase in Learning Recognition credits for Auckland students from 1 per 5 credits to 1 per 4 credits gained.

The question was asked as to whether more support is needed for students to assist with their achievement next term.

At this time there is no indication that the Urgent Relief Fund will be revised again this year.

There will be a large number of students who have not been engaged during this lockdown period and it will be difficult for some to re-engage.

Staff are preparing for a big Term 4 so as to get as many students as possible across the line.

The question was raised as to whether extra funding from the BOT could assist with after school or weekend programmes? However, it was felt that teachers will be offering this anyway. There are also a number of online courses available for students.
