Ngā mihi mahana ki a koutou,

Warm greetings, talofa lava, malo e lelei, kia orana, fakalofa lahi atu, bula vinaka, namaste,

While the start of the year wasn't quite what we had hoped for by moving to the red traffic light setting, we were still able to enjoy a summer break that allowed people to leave Auckland and visit family and friends around the motu. The weather certainly smiled on us all.



The staff at PHS are looking forward to the opportunities that 2022 will bring. It was great welcoming back our senior students last week and there is lots of positive energy in the school. At the end of last year we sadly farewelled a number of staff but this year has brought in new staff with a wide range of skills and experience to contribute to our community. We welcome the following staff, Sheethal Deeplal as teacher of Hard Materials, George Smith who will be teaching in Maths and Business Studies, Ji Hyan Park is joining the Art Department, Julian Abel in English, Melanie Harpur in Maths/Science, Grace Tofa in Social Sciences, Valentino Adam in Physical Education and Health and Campbell Bolton-Hampton as a Music teacher. We also welcome a new librarian, Louise Dreadon and Phoenix Ruatara as Careers Assistant and Arts Coordinator. We are excited to see the contribution they will make to our learners in the coming years.

Inevitably, our NCEA results were affected by the extended lockdown period last year. Level 1 results were down by about 10% and Level 2 by 20%. This is a reflection of the number of students who disengaged from school during and after the lockdown. We know that there were a number of reasons for this, including students working. For those who didn't achieve I would encourage them to return to school in 2022. NCEA allows students to achieve two levels in one year and our team are prepared to support them to catch up on what was missed.

On a positive note, our students achieved significantly higher numbers of merit and excellence endorsements last year. At Level 2, 11% more students achieved an endorsement than in 2020. Overall, the school reached all endorsement targets, which were above the national averages for Decile 1 schools for Levels 1 and 2. Our University Entrance results were 5% higher than in 2021 and since 2017, our percentage achieving UE has tripled. I am so proud of our students and staff for all of the hard work that has gone into these results. At Papakura High we are raising the bar for our students and the high expectations are paying off.

Our major foci for this year are on growing our new programmes and developing others. The Reo Rūmaki, 'Te Mita o Te Reo', is expanding with more subjects taught in Te Reo this year and we have employed extra staff members to help grow this Kaupapa. The Services Academy is currently looking for a new Director and we are looking at new programmes in Early Childhood Education, Building and Construction and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics). These will provide clearer pathways into the careers in these areas.

We will also be looking to develop a learner profile for our students and will be consulting with the community on the types of knowledge, skills and competencies that are valued for our students.

This will lead into the development of our new strategic direction over the next 3-5 years and everyone will have an opportunity to contribute to this process.

Finally, we will be looking at our timetable and day structure to see what changes can be made to support learning in our school. We are hoping to roll these changes out in 2023.

In other great news, we have secured funding from the Lotteries Community Facilities Fund, Ministry of Education and NZCT to complete our project to cover our courts in astro-turf and to build a floodlit shade structure. This is a big project for our school and community and when finished will be a real asset to the school. Work should begin on this later on this month.

Wood was ordered and has now arrived in time for students to start work on their various projects.


