However, she has promised to come back in a couple of years and we will definitely take her up on this promise! Thank you, Whaea for all of your hard work with our roopu and for gaining promotion to Division 1 for our school, a great legacy to leave behind at PHS.

This will provide us with important information for changes we need to make to our curriculum and the ways we teach. It is an important sign of engagement with school when students are involved in outside school activities and our most successful students are the ones who have consistently got involved. Finally, one of the consequences of the pandemic disruption has been a significant drop off in attendance. Shonté has joined us as a teacher in the Life Preparation programme (Services Academy). She has had previous experience working with young people as part of the Graham Dingle Foundation programme.


She is working together with Staff Shauna, Vijay and other external providers to support our students on their journey through school and on to the wider world.

Rural Employment Initative

On Tuesday 19 April a group of eight students will fly to the South Island for a 5-day trip around West Otago to see and sample employment opportunities in the rural sector with a strong focus on the dairy industry.

The South is short of workers, with some paying agencies up to \$2,000 to find workers, and our students might not otherwise get the chance to gain exposure to the opportunities available out of Auckland.

This is a project that aims to benefit both the dairy industry as well as the youth of South Auckland. Amongst other things, our students will get to experience first hand dairy farming, agricultural contracting (silage harvesting, baling, ground work and effluent spreading), haulage (milk, bobby calf collection, stock etc), river fishing, sheep farming (rousing, pressing and yard work) eeling and clay bird shooting. Thanks to Mr Craggs for making this happen for our students.



Recycle a Device (RAD)

The team from the RAD project (Recycle a device) have provided training to our rangatahi to learn how to refurbish devices. Remojo Tech, the CEO - Hadi Daoudand and two of his employed students from Auckland Seventh-Day Adventist High School were amazing and had our students engaged in this kaupapa. We are thankful to the organisers Chris Ofanoa and Bronwyn Scott and to Mr Singh for organizing the two days. The repaired devices will be available to the local community and to Papakura


